# Fr. Matthew Gamber heads to World Youth Day in Panama

As you read this week's bulletin I will be *en route* to Panama City, Panama with a group of our parish young adults to join World Youth Days 2019. We will join with hundreds of thousands of other pilgrims from throughout the world, along with Pope Francis, for a week-long celebration of our Catholic faith. The theme of this year is taken from the Gospel of St. Luke, quoting The Blessed Mother Mary in her Magnificat: "I am a servant of the Lord, let it be done to me according to Your Word." Deepening the truth of this scripture passage and applying it to our lives will the underlying work of the whole week which we hope is a moving retreat experience.

World Youth Days were started during the papacy of Pope John Paul II who had a special affinity for gathering with young people and sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with them. I have been blessed to attend the past 7 gatherings which has brought me to amazing cities throughout the world: Rome, Toronto, Cologne, Sydney, Madrid, Rio de Janeiro and Krakow. The Pope picks the city and then the bishops of that country get busy planning to host him and millions of others who come.

This year, Pope Francis wanted to highlight the Church in Central and South America and so invited the young people of the world to gather with him for a week of prayer, teaching, cultural enlightenment and Christian fellowship. Each Day the pilgrims gather for Mass and catechesis in their language groups at different churches or convention halls throughout the city. In the afternoon and evening there is time to attend concerts, talks, art exhibits and other exciting opportunities. On Thursday January 24 is a welcome gathering with the Pope, and on Friday we will walk the Stations of the Cross with him throughout the entire city. On Saturday we hike ten miles to Metro Park in Panama and camp out over night with all the other pilgrims. The Pope will lead an evening prayer service and celebrate Sunday morning Mass.

About 500 pilgrims from the U.S. will fly together to Panama. We plan to visit the canal and the Gamboa Rainforest during our limited free time.

World Youth Day follows the Synod on Youth that was held in Rome last fall, and it gives the Pope a chance to highlight the themes of evangelization, service, and community which are priorities for the world's young people. We will carry with us the hopes and prayers of the young people of our parish and of the Archdiocese. Please accompany us with your own prayers and your ears: Listen on AM 740 Radio for my daily reports from Panama on Sacred Heart Catholic Radio between 6-8am and 4-6 pm each day next week. Tune in please. Ora pro nos. Adios amigos.

Financial Note: With the new tax law almost doubling the standard deduction, many parishioners who previously deducted their charitable giving to St X may no longer find it advantageous to do so. If you are over age 70.5 and are required to take a distribution from your IRA, you can circumvent the tax law change and still, in effect, deduct your charitable gifts to St. X by giving to St X directly from your IRA. This gift would count as a part of your required distribution, yet would not count as income to you, so effectively giving you a deduction you might not otherwise get. #### 200 Years - 200 Facts

- ❖ About 50 Catholics attended our first Mass in 1819 at Liberty and Vine, named Christ Church.
- ❖ The new Bishop Edward Fenwick, O.P. returned to the new Cincinnati diocese Sun March 24, 1822
- ❖ July 6, 1822 the new bishop bought a 25 sq. ft. lot on Sycamore Street ... on credit for \$700
- ❖ Ignatius Loyola sent a young Francis Xavier to Goa, India in March 1540, six months before the Jesuit order was officially founded.




