FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR Our Parish Examen

In the United States, there are 66 Jesuit parishes. A Jesuit parish is one guided by the *Spiritual Exercises* of St. Ignatius Loyola – which encourages people to reflect on their experiences and to discern God's presence in their lives. A Jesuit parish aims to nurture lay leadership as well as personal faith. It is also committed to "the faith that does justice" by way of solidarity with the poor and dedication to the greater good. Jesuit parishes are linked by a spiritual bond.

Last fall, in anticipation of our 2019 Bicentennial year, I decided to ask our parish leadership (staff, councils, and volunteers) to go through a process called "The Parish Examen." It is a way to reflect on our experience as a Jesuit parish and to see how we might grow in our commitments in the coming years. Many of you participated in these deliberations, and I thank you for your input. We completed this Examen in December, and the results of our discussion and reflection are now posted on our parish website at www.stxchurch.org/Parish-Life. I encourage you to read my letter to the Jesuit provincial in Chicago regarding our Examen and the hopes we have for the future. It is like a strategic plan, in many ways, and our goals ought to be revisited and revised as necessary. For now, we ask you to read over them.

Our Parish Sacristy

One of the goals we have for the coming years (as discovered in our Examen) was to "grow in vibrancy" in our Eucharistic celebrations. This vibrancy is not only shown in our preaching, song, and worship style, but in the care we have for this radiant worship space. Fr. Diehl made great strides 30 years ago in the painting and restructuring of the church interior. However, no attention was given to the **sacristy** areas behind the scenes. You may be asking, "What is a sacristy?" The sacristy area are the rooms behind the altar where the priests and ministry prepare for Mass. Ours is through that door to the left of the altar. It is where we store the vessels, vestments, decorations and linens used in church to make our liturgies and Masses more vibrant.

Right now our sacristy area is in dire need of some **repair and renovation**. Many parts of it are beautiful and reflect our history. Other parts are downright horrible, outdated, and hazardous. During this Bicentennial year, we are making great strides for a makeover of our sacristy area. So, I want to invite you to tour the sacristy area after my Masses. This month, I will invite folks to come back and walk through our rooms to see the great need. Hopefully we might elicit your support for this project and bring a vibrancy to our church that parallels the great work done in our history. Please keep in prayer our efforts to bring greater honor and glory to God and to this 200 year-old community. *– Fr Patrick Fairbanks, S.J.*, Pastor

Financial Note: With the new tax law almost doubling the standard deduction, many parishioners who previously deducted their charitable giving to St X may no longer find it advantageous to do so. If you are over age 70.5 and are required to take a distribution from your IRA, you can circumvent the tax law change and still, in effect, deduct your charitable gifts to St. X by giving to St X directly from your IRA. This gift would count as a part of your required distribution, yet would not count as income to you, so effectively giving you a deduction you might not otherwise get. 200 Years ***** 200 Facts

- May 29, 1848 St Xavier "Free Parochial School" opened for the first time.
- In March 1860, demolition of the 1826 church began, in order to build this present church. But when a wall of the old building collapsed, thirteen laborers were killed.
- 1864: St. Thomas Church (our auxiliary) opened on the west side of Sycamore between 5th and 6th.
- 1886: "St Ann's Colored Church and School" is established with the financial help of St X parish.
