Is this a question or a statement as it pertains to St. Xavier Parish? As we begin to celebrate this our Bicentennial year, a look back or maybe a little time for reflection would be good for the soul. The Gospel readings from Luke, the last two weeks, lays out the parameters to attain **blessedness**. Can you see how blessed you are as a parishioner here at St. X Church?

Over the past two hundred years, numerous people have poured themselves into this church. Whether as priests, staff, servers, sacristans, committee members, maintenance, volunteers of all sorts, they did it all for the Greater Glory of God (AMDG). They wanted to provide a worship space that spoke of their praise to God. Physical changes were made, some good some bad, along with changes in the Mass. Generations have served this parish and we have all benefitted from their efforts.

As I look over old drawings and blueprints along with old files of projects completed, I think of the hours spent in meetings, planning sessions, architect interviews and bids along with project updates to completion. Dedicated people giving of their time, talent and treasure made it all happen each time.

I have been blessed to be given the opportunity to serve this parish as Facilities Manager. I have been here on a part time basis for the past year and a half. I have witnessed the new generation of dedicated parishioners firsthand. The individuals that serve on our Facilities, Worship and Finance Committees along with Parish Council have the best interest of this parish, and it shows. The past, present and future are always part of any and all conversations. The different small groups that meet for study, fellowship and/or outreach are inspiring.

In the past year and a half I have tried to make my own positive changes to the worship space. We have changed out most of the lighting to L.E.D.'s. We added lights to brighten the main altar and the choir loft. We painted the floors to be lighter, cleaner and durable. A safety issue with one of the front sandstone steps was addressed along with numerous maintenance issues. Soon we will provide listening devices to help those with hearing issues in this grand old space.

As Father Pat stated in last week's Bulletin we are looking at the future of the sacristy. The sacristy has been somewhat ignored. A few small projects have taken place as "band aids" i.e. restroom, windows, and HVAC units. It is a useable space, but not the most efficient or aesthetically pleasing. A plan is in the works with a committee led by Fr. Pat to remodel the sacristy to last far into the future.

In my rounds with input from the committees, I have created a list of future needs. Some noticeable (painting, front doors), and some behind the scenes (light dimmer, clock/bell system) are thirty years old.

How blessed are we to be a part of this parish under the spirit of St. Francis Xavier and St. Ignatius Loyola. (statement/question). How blessed are we to have this opportunity to serve Our Lord and each other. Is this statement or question?

About Todays' Gospel

Last week, someone said to me after Mass, "Father Pat, I didn't realize that we have two versions of the Beatitudes in the Gospels." Even though I had only a few minutes to respond, I started in on the similarities and differences between the two versions.

One we have from Matthew (Ch. 5), and the other one is from Luke (last Sunday's Gospel). Matthew's version lists 8 "blessed are ..." Beatitudes, but Luke's only list 4, and then 4 "woe to you" warnings. Also, Matthew's are in 3rd person (Blessed are the poor...) but Luke's are in 2nd person (Blessed are you poor). But one of the greatest differences is that Matthew shows Jesus delivering these words from the top of a large hill (Sermon on the Mount) like Moses did, and Luke shows Jesus Jooking up, delivering the words from level ground (Sermon on the Plain). Matthew wanted to identify with the Jews, and Luke wanted to sound more inclusive. Recall also that St. Luke's audience is primarily Gentile and Greek: i.e. they were not raised Jewish. He wanted to welcome the poor, the outcast, women, etc. and so is more inclusive. Matthew's audience was primarily Jewish men who were converting to Christ. And so you can see why there are these differences.

It is good to keep in mind that the 4 Gospel writers differ from each other because they have different audiences, different emphases, and different needs to address ... while still preaching and proclaiming the one Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The Gospel passage from last Sunday, today, and next Sunday are all taken from Luke's "Sermon on the Plain." See if you can find more similarities between Luke and Matthew. – FrF

- ❖ 1847 Fr. George A. Carrell S.J. is the second pastor of St Xavier Church for less than a year.
- ❖ 1848-9 Fr. Angelus Masselle S.J. and Fr. Florian Sautois S.J. also serve one-year terms as pastor.
- ❖ 1849 Fr. Charles Driscoll S.J. becomes the fifth pastor of St Xavier Church and eventually serves the longest as pastor (a heroic 36 years).
- ❖ 1859 The present church building was erected here in the French-Gothic architectural style.
