MAKING A DIFFERENCE



A JUBILEE is a time to Recall, to Remember and to Relive God's grace and blessings in one's life and in one's community. It was also a time to set things right in one's life. What about you? During this anniversary Jubilee at St Xavier ... is there something that needs to set right in your life?

Anniversaries are times to look back with gratitude and look ahead with a purpose. In the last two hundred years, the parish has accomplished much. It has grown in numbers; it has established credibility in the city and the archdiocese. It has produced missionaries both lay and religious and helped to establish churches beyond the borders.

The motto of our bicentennial year has been Remember, Rejoice and Reach Out. We have the opportunity as a parish to examine ourselves and set new priorities for the years ahead. We were also blessed during this time to consider the Four Preferences of the Society of Jesus: (1) Promoting Discernment and the Spiritual Exercises (2) Walking with the excluded (3) Caring for our common home, and (4) Journeying with youth. All these are means to achieve the purpose of our life: to praise, reverence and serve God. You can make a difference with your commitment to this renewal and revisioning. We invite you to join us actively and be a game changer.



To continue the trend of beautiful music in our historic church, the liturgy of the 10:30 Mass on May 26 will showcase the talents of the **Psalm 150 Brass Ensemble.** The triumphal music of Easter performed on brass instruments is sure to enkindle the spirit of praise in everyone.

200 Years **❖** 200 Facts

- ♦ February 22, 1904: Our parochial school children observed Washington's birthday in a very Christian and patriotic manner. A new US flag, donated by Mr. Robert Patton, was blessed after the 8 am Mass. Then the children carried it south on Sycamore Street to the school. While the flag was being hoisted, 1200 young voices sang "The Star Spangled Banner."
- ♦ In 1904, the greatest "mission" ever given in Cincinnati came to a close in our church. Day and night for four weeks the church has been thronged from the altar steps to the door, and often hundreds were turned away for fear of overtaxing the capacity of the immense edifice. 15,000 confessions were heard. More than 12,000 communions received!
- ♦ In Sept of 1906, 625 boys and 570 girls were enrolled in the St. Xavier Parochial School, which was tuition free following the creation of the St. Xavier School Association in 1902. The average annual cost per student was less than \$7.00.
- ♦ In 1908, The Young Men's Sodality of St. Xavier Church published a little booklet entitled "A Word About Sodalities." Sodalities, which were very popular in the 19th century, were a type of religious club. Each sodality had a particular focus and St. Xavier Church had several sodalities.


