

# **Happy Easter-Blessed Memorial Day**

On this Sixth Sunday of the Easter Season – just two more until the Season ends, once we celebrate The Ascension next week and Pentecost the following week – it is good and proper that we continue to wish one another "Happy Easter" and to continue to marinate in the truth of Jesus' Resurrection from the dead which we began celebrating 5 weeks ago on Easter Sunday.

In the Church's wisdom and sense of wonder, it is good and fitting that we have a longer season to celebrate Easter – 50 days because of its primacy in our faith. It also signifies that the joy of Easter exceeds the preceding season of Lent by ten days, and this means our Easter feasting should exceed our Lenten fasting. The liturgies of the Easter Season continue to offer us accounts of the Resurrection of Christ and to recount the early days of the Church as the Apostles began to share the Good News of Jesus.

Many people devoutly attend daily Mass during the Lenten Season which is a very excellent habit to form, but then they stop attending after Easter Sunday. They miss out on the daily experience of meeting the Risen Lord in the Word and in the special prayers of the Easter Season. Try to attend a daily Mass in the next few weeks to imbibe of this Easter Joy at the greatest place possible – around the Altar where Heaven and Earth meet in the Risen Lord who gives us Himself in Holy Communion.

One thing I learned recently when examining the history of Memorial Day is to not say "Happy Memorial Day." Why? I'll let a military wife and daughter explain:

"I would encourage the following: Please do not say Happy Memorial Day. It is a hard day for our Gold Star Families (families of military personnel who died in battle). Avoid Memorial Day Sales, this is profiting off our military. Please pray for military chaplains. We currently have a shortage of Catholic chaplains in the military. We need more vocations for this 'call within a call.' Catholics make up about 20 % of the U.S. Armed Forces! Our family is laying flags at a National Cemetery tomorrow and attending Mass on Monday. God bless our Gold Star Families. May we pray for the souls of the departed who died serving our country."

So perhaps we should say "Blessed Memorial Day" and dedicate some part of the day to prayer and remembrance of our fallen heroes. The day was originally called "Decoration Day" after the Civil War, and it marked a day for citizens to decorate with flags and flowers those who had died in the Civil War to eradicate slavery and preserve the unity of the United States of America. Mass and confessions will be offered at St. Xavier on Monday, May 27 - this year's Memorial Day.

I have vibrant memories of Memorial Day in my hometown near Chicago. My Dad was an Army veteran and we had a flag pole in our backyard that he loved and tended with care. We would walk to the town center and observe the Memorial Day Parade and ride

our red white and blue decorated bikes down the main street. Veterans' groups and current military personnel would march in impressive formations. In the afternoon we went to a park and met up with all the families of my mother's high school friends. They were called the "Phisdenfers Club" which is Friendship all scrambled up. We would play all day until we were packed back into the family station wagon and went home very late even though it was a "School Night." The children and parents are all close friends from just that annual picnic. Many of my Dad's friends had served in the Korean War and World War II and there was a sense of pride and accomplishment in our country that was passed on to a new generation.

Some recommended activities for Memorial Day:

- Pray for the dead, especially those who were lost in conflict
  - Visit a military cemetery and lay flags and flowers
- Learn more about soldier saints in Church history such as St. Ignatius Loyola, our Jesuit founder
- Support charities that help families of fallen soldiers such as American Widow Project, Fallen Patriots, etc.


### St. Xavier Engaged Retreats


