



IESUIT ORDINATIONS 2019

Every year, during the first week of June, Jesuits from the Upper Midwest Province (UMI) all gather in Milwaukee for what we call "Province Days." This year, we will be gathering Friday to Sunday, June 7-9 on the campus of Marquette University, this year for a day conference on "Evangelization." But more importantly, we all assemble Saturday in the downtown Jesuit Church of the Gesu for the ordination of 4 new Jesuits to the priesthood: Matthew Spotts, S.J., James Sand, S.J., Bryan Norton, S.J. and Greg Ostdiek, S.J. Matt and James are both graduates of St Xavier High School, and Bryan was a teacher at Xavier University as part of his Jesuit formation. Greg hails from Dayton and went to Carroll H.S. and UD. All of these men will celebrate their first Mass the next day, which will be Pentecost Sunday. Matt Spotts will celebrate his first Mass in Cincinnati here at St. Xavier Church on Saturday June 22 at our 4pm Mass. Please join us. 200 Years * 200 Facts

- ❖ When Fr. Driscoll died in 1885, Fr. Patrick Ward S.J. became the 6th pastor of St Xavier Church, serving a term of 5 years.
- From Oct 31, 1917 to the end of the war, the St Xavier Knitting Unit made 676 sweaters, 282 pairs of socks, 62 mufflers, 60 pairs of wristlets, 4 shawls, 3 trench caps, and 2 eye bandages.
- ❖ In 1917, The Sewing Unit provided 160 body binders, 120 slings, 100 bed socks, 50 shirts, 43 handkerchiefs, 22 suits of pajamas, 20 comfort kits, 22 wash-cloths, and 17 pillows.
- ♦ In 1926 St. Xavier Church congregation numbered 295 families. 855 Students in St. Xavier parish school, 24 teachers and 23 classrooms. 10 Sodalities numbering 1,675 members.
