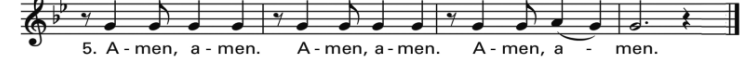

The Fire of Pentecost

Summer is a wonderful season. Though the calendar has not yet proclaimed it, the season has essentially begun. Summer is a time for a change of pace. It is a time to travel and explore new territory. A time to stretch the day longer and do more things.

We have many missions on our schedules, many places to visit. Vacations, whether close to home, a campground, a state park, or far away to some foreign territory, bring with them excitement at discovering new things, meeting new people, seeing new wonders. Summer is also the time when the church makes available its hospitality to those we call missionaries. Throughout the summer people, both lay and ordained, travel to strange places to tell of the work and need in the territory in which they minister. They come to where people gather, here in church, and share stories of the wonders of God and the witness to the Holy Spirit.

Have you ever noticed how people gather? What draws them to one place? Build a fire in your backyard fire pit and people appear. Start a campfire and family come out of the tents to enjoy its warmth and light. Place a log in the fireplace and conversations begin. Fire draws people together. Perhaps that is why the Holy Spirit came to the Apostles in the symbol of fire.

On the feast of Pentecost (meaning 50 days) a feast of the first harvest celebrated 50 days after the feast of Unleavened Bread, the Apostles of Our Lord were still in Jerusalem unsure of their mission. The Holy Spirit came to them and ignited their souls with the mission for which Jesus had prepared them. The Holy Spirit revealed to them the proper use of the gifts and charisms they each possessed.

The Holy Spirit of God continued to act in their lives just as Jesus promised. The gifts we have received are not gifts for us to hold, but to share. While Pentecost is traditionally seen as the birthday of the Church – the day where she was manifest to the larger faith community – the gifts of the Holy Spirit that the Apostles received on that “birthday” were to be used for the building of the church. The spiritual gifts were to be used for mission.

We too are commissioned by the Holy Spirit through our Baptism and Confirmation to execute our mission with compassion for all people—and to do so with the courage of the Apostles, for the good and unity of the community locally and in territories around the world—and to always remember we do so because we are called Christians, and Christians are called for mission. “Go, set the world on fire!”

St. Xavier Engaged Retreats

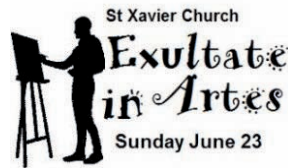

200 Years ❖ 200 Facts

Researched by St X parishioner Jennifer Thumm

- ❖ In 1901, The St. Stanislaus Sodality was started for boys between the ages of 12-18 who work or attend non-Catholic schools.
- ❖ In 1915, the St. Xavier Sewing School (for girls over 16) made 385 garments for poor children. These garments were distributed by the Ladies' Aid Society.
- ❖ In 1909, Father Boarman, S.J. director of the St. Stanislaus Sodality, had entirely renovated the boy's club room under St. Thomas Church with four shuffle board tables and many amusing games.
- ❖ In July 1910, ten boys and twelve girls received their certificate from the Commercial Courses of St. Xavier Parish School and took positions downtown as stenographers, book-keepers, etc.
