

#### OUR PARISH SURVEY by Fr. Fairbanks S.J.

In our parish bulletin dated October 27, I explained a little about Ignatian Discernment – a prayerful process by which Jesuits endeavor to follow the will of God, especially in the placing of men in certain apostolic works. I then announced that my Provincial has asked me to engage in a discernment about my next assignment. He asked that I be available for a new mission in May 2020. I replied "Yes," which means that I will be leaving St Xavier Church in six months. For now, that is all can say about the future. Thanks for understanding the limitations of discernment.

So, last week, I initiated a **Parish Survey** to ask input from YOU regarding our vision for the future. Our **Parish Survey** was created on-line on Wed Oct 28. I sent it to our parish staff, councils and subcommittees. It also went out to all parish liturgical ministers. It was broadly advertised in our St Xavier News Flash. The survey was promoted in the bulletin on Nov 3, and we announced the survey at weekday Masses and at all Sunday Masses. It can be found right on the front page of our website **www.stxchurch.org**. As of this writing (Mon Nov 4),

www.stxchurch.org. As of this writing (Mon Nov 4), we have received 40 responses from the survey. The survey has only 10 questions. The average time to complete it was 12 minutes. The survey is "open" until November 25, 2019. If you have not yet participated, please do. To pique your interest, I will print some random comments below:

/ We could do more to build a sense of community. I think many people just come to Mass. / We could coordinate better with Bellarmine and St X High School to rotate more priests from all to preside and even minister. I know it is a commuter parish but I wish there were more of a connection. / We make everyone feel welcome. Not divisive or unflinchingly doctrinaire. / Bring back more traditional hymns, some Latin, more opportunity to worship the Eucharist outside Mass. / We have had two fantastic pastors in a row. VERY different in style, but both rich in faith, engaging inter-personally, moving homilists, and dynamic in their leadership and stewardship of St. Xavier. / Eliminate 12 Sunday Mass / Teaching and inspiring are done very well at St. Xavier. / We need more outreach programs to the homeless and mentally sick people in our neighborhood / We do ministry and outreach to all demographics for 200 years. / Go back to donuts after Sunday mass once a month. Or maybe monthly pot lucks. More informal community events. / When I became a parishioner, it would have been nice to have received some sort of welcome letter. / Sunday Mass is always a moving and special experience. The music ministry is amazing! The use of incense at 10:30 is wonderful. The outstanding mix of Catholic tradition and modern worship provides a perfect balance for holiness and goodness. / Put the tabernacle back at the center of the high altar / I appreciate lots of sacraments! Lovely music and preaching / Find more reliable lay ministers (readers, distributors) / We are good at providing opportunities for community engagement, such as Tender Mercies, St. Vincent de Paul, and Virgin of Nazareth. / I dislike the interior paint colors; that the bathrooms are the first thing you see when you enter the vestibule / We do well the quality of the Mass. I think people feel welcomed when attending Mass / I don't like that parking is not free during the week if I attend Mass; only on Sat-Sunday / I don't like people banging those wooden kneelers what seems like as hard as they can as inconsiderately and untimely as possible. / Music ministry is great. Dr. Bailey is excellent.

#### 200 Years **\*** 200 Facts

Researched by St X parishioner Jennifer Thumm

- ❖ In 1904 Fr. Francis J. Finn, S.J. established the St. Xavier Commercial School. This 2 yr. program provided HS boys and girls with a business education instead of factory jobs. Boys were taught by the Brothers of Mary until 1935. Girls taught by the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur until 1960 when the school closed its doors.
- ❖ By letter dated December 18, 1931, M. F. Hoffman of the city water works notified the St. X Free Day Nursery that the free water service it enjoyed since 1918 would terminate at the end of 1931.
- On the evening of December 21, 1933, all of the St. Xavier Parochial School grade children were invited to attend the Crosley Radio Corporation's annual Christmas Party at Music Hall.
- In June of 1934 Mr. John J. Drennan, the head usher of St. Xavier Church, was recognized for his 50 years of service as an usher. Mr. Drennan remembered clearly the catastrophe of the burning of St. Xavier Church in 1882. What seemed to have impressed him most in this calamity was the falling of the spire, leaving the massive cross on the sidewalk across the street.
