

200 Years * 200 Facts

Researched by St X parishioner Jennifer Thumm

- In 1954 St X presented "JOY for the World", written by Fr. Daniel A. Lord, featuring the Xavier Thespians, presented at Cincinnati Gardens, and as St. Xavier's Marian Year gift to Our Lady.
- ❖ In August/Sept 1967 Marcellus Becker, at the age of 78, retired after serving as St. Xavier organist and music director for 41 years. He worked 7 days a week often arriving at 5:30 am to climb the 33 steps to choir loft. At his passing, Pastor James McCummiskey calculated that Becker had climbed "more than 200 miles into space to provide heavenly music for us over these years."
- In 1978 The Novena of Grace was featured by the display of a zuchetto cap worn by St. Francis in the Orient. It has been here at least 100 years. With it is a document of authentication, dated Jan. 12, 1742, and bearing the official seal of Vy. Rev. Francis Retz, General of the Society at that time.
- ❖ In 1995 Fr. Robert Thesing S.J. was assigned as the 19th pastor of St. Xavier Church and served us as such for ten years.
