Here I Am, Lord

With the festive season of Christmas behind we enter into Ordinary Time. This is the brief few weeks from the end of Christmas to the beginning of Lent. There is nothing ordinary about Ordinary Time. It is simply a period on the liturgical calendar marked in a numbered, or ordered progression, between the major liturgical seasons. A quick glance or casual hearing of the Sacred Scriptures for this week tell us that these are not mundane or ordinary in that sense. They are rich and full of meaning. Homing in on the first reading from the Book of Samuel we hear God calling young Samuel to be a prophet. A prophet, we know, is one who speaks the Word of God, one who is the human voice of God to carry His message to the people.

Though he didn't realize it was God calling him at first, Samuel answers with a very humble, "Here I am, Lord." It can be difficult to hear God's voice amidst the noise of life. There are so many voices shouting at us, so many activities, responsibilities, and demands, that the voice of God gets crowded out. When we do take the time to be in prayer or to quiet ourselves so as to listen to God we seldom respond with "Here I am, Lord." Rather, we tend to run and hide. Being found by God is scary enough without actually listening to Him. Too often we admit God exists and even that God is present in our lives, but we don't really want him to seek us out and talk to us. That would make us accountable, and accountability is just one more stress we don't want in our lives.

When God calls us, we'd rather say, "sorry you have the wrong number," or "he's busy right now, would you like to leave a message?" We can't screen God's calls. Oh sure, we can ignore them, as we often do, but God is persistent. We have to realize that God does not bring bad news. God only desires the best for His children. Does God demand accountability for our actions? Certainly. What parent, spouse, friend or employer does not? But accountability to God is the path of freedom, happiness, and eternal life. This Ordinary Time before we get to Lent and its wonderful messages, when we hear God calling let us stop and respond, "Here I am, Lord, thanks so much for reaching out and calling me. Now, speak Lord for your servant is listening." We just might find that this is no ordinary time!

The Lord Loves a Generous Heart

No one can predict a world mired in a pandemic. Every plan, program and liturgy are all put forth with speculation. The Giving Tree program this past Christmas was no exception. Everyone from the agencies themselves to the parishioner contacts, to the parish staff were uncertain if the program could succeed. Most of agencies asked for gift cards which are not exciting gifts. But it was the only way they could continue their ministry which they did one-to-one. With less people attending Mass, the opportunities for tags to be taken from the tree seemed limited. But once again the immense generosity of the St. Xavier parishioners stepped up to the challenge. This year there were around 300 tags on the tree and all but a few were taken. Those few didn't matter as the cash contribution and larger gift card amount more than made up for them.

The recipients of this year's Giving Tree: Peaslee Center, Cincinnati Area Senior Services and Our Daily Bread received over \$3,000 in gift cards collectively. In addition, gifts to Little Brothers Friends of the Elderly and First Step Home were the largest St. Xavier has ever collected for these agencies. From Little Brothers comes this note of gratitude:

"Particularly this year, with all of the chaos going on, we deeply appreciate your generosity and time to think of the elderly and help us with our Wish List Program. Without selfless people like the St. Xavier parishioners, we could not do this.

You are an essential link in this program, and we thank you. This year we provided gifts to four area nursing homes and approximately 150 elderly living independently. This has been an especially difficult year for them and knowing that someone cares about them is a life saver... and that life saver is you!"
