Farewell message from Fr. Fairbanks, S.J.

"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times." Dickens captured well the feeling of late 18th century Europe, and those are not so different from our own. At the end of April 2020, I am feeling too the motions of good times and bad. April 30 was my last day as pastor, and starting May 1 our parish welcomes Fr. Bob Thesing S.J. as the interim pastor until Fr. Lickteig arrives in September.

It is with sadness that I depart, and I will certainly miss you all. I am most grateful to Fr. Thesing, especially for taking over amid two separate crises--the worst of times. The first crisis is obviously the Covid pandemic, and the second is my own health misfortune. Early Sunday morning a week back, I suffered a mild heart attack and was taken quickly to Good Sam to be checked by expert cardiologists. Via angiogram, they found a small blockage and decided it best to treat the ischemia with medicines. I am very grateful for their attention and care, and that I was out and back to the Jesuit community Tuesday afternoon.

However, it is Jesuit policy that anyone who has spent significant time in a foreign country, city, or location of risk (i.e. a hospital) ought to undergo a 14 day quarantine before coming back into the house. So, I find myself next door on the campus of XU with 14 days to pray, relax, recover, read, take lots of pills, and lots of naps. Indeed this will be a time of retreat for me, "the best of times." I will be able to pray for each of the St Xavier parishioners, and I will keep in prayer any intentions that I receive from you.

Later this spring, before I leave for Chicago, I hope we can arrange a time for a "final Mass" and reception. Although the exact time is unclear now, we will keep you posted as directives appear. For now, thank you for your prayers and best intentions which may be sent to the parish office at St X: 611 Sycamore, 45202.

My Letter of Gratitude: April 30, 2020

Dear friends and parishioners,

Today marks the end of a beautiful journey of grace for me at St Xavier Church. Tomorrow, I will step down as pastor, and former pastor, Fr. Bob Thesing S.J., will serve as your parish administrator until the permanent pastor arrives in September. In the days ahead, I plan to savor the abundant blessings received here during my upcoming two-week "retreat" at the start of May. And I will do so by remembering each of you by name.

On Friday May 1, First Friday and Feast of St Joseph, I will celebrate a private Mass of Thanksgiving at the very same time as the Jesuit community gathers for daily Mass at 5:00 pm. It will be a time of **holy gratitude** to God for all the graces received in the last seven years as your pastor. Times of transition offer a mixture of sadness, anxiety and confidence: sadness because I am leaving a place that has become my spiritual home for the last 7 years. Anxiety goes along with the tenor of these uncertain days, health issues, and with the fluid transition to my next assignment in Chicago. The future that awaits me is still not clearly in view. But ultimately, I have a sense of confidence because I know deep down that God will be as faithful tomorrow as in the past. "Give me only your love and your grace, that is enough for me."

I am so grateful to all of you for the many small ways you have inspired me and (yes) *called me* to be a better priest, a better person. That is the Christian vocation: to hear the call of the Lord in the people around you, and then to respond with trust – to go forward with eyes fixed on the Heart that created you from dust. In an extra special way, I want to thank and bless my fellow Jesuits (especially Fr. Joe Casey, S.J.) who have guided and supported me in the ways of parish ministry.

Oh, I cannot thank my staff enough. These pastoral people love you and the Lord more than you can know. They have offered time and talent to the fulfilling of our mission to live the Gospel. And I must acknowledge every single one of our faithful St X volunteers: those 10% who seem to "do everything" and help when the need is greatest. You know who you are! You are ministers too, and often unnamed and unseen. Indeed the Lord has seen the important work you do, and He will bless you with His Spirit to carry on with new leaders to come.

I give thanks to our benefactors and alumni for whom this parish owes its very structure and body. Many hearts are set on fire the moment they walk into the doors. I know mine did. In a way my departure is a closing of the full circle. It was in November 1987 when I walked through the front door of church hoping to find yet one more brochure that explained how to join the Jesuits. I found the last brochure and read it as I sat in the last pew by the statue of St Thérèse. I joined the Society two years later, and from that time until now, this holy community has given life to me and so many others. It has been a privilege to be at a parish of so many empowered leaders working towards a shared purpose: inward reflection / outward ACTION!

Especially when folks found out about my recent health crisis, I have been taken by the outpouring of gratitude and prayerful words and blessings. Even though we are not able to embrace and touch, I know that our spiritual companionship will endure beyond any "distancing" that will happen in months to come.

When the doors open again, if you ever find yourself in the "Windy City" don't hesitate to get in touch.
