This is a wonderful opportunity to participate in the Jubilee Year of Hope. Please let Sandy or Corinne know if you will be attending by Monday, July 21st.





Friends,

On Sunday, April 20, 2025, Pope Francis gave his final "Urbi er Orbi" message from Saint Peter's Square, the day before he died. Like so many of his messages, his final message was one of Christ's love, hope, and forgiveness. In a world torn apart by war and violence, poverty, the destruction of the family and creation, Pope Francis once more told us to hope - to hope in the resurrection, to hope in our God, to hope that peace is possible, to hope in each other, especially the stranger. On his final Easter Sunday, he dared us to believe:

"Love has triumphed over hatred, light over darkness and truth over falsehood. Forgiveness has triumphed over revenge. Evil has not disappeared from history; it will remain until the end, but it no longer has the upper hand; it no longer has the power over those who accept the grace of this day."

As pilgrims of hope, we travel to the basilica of Saint Stanislaus later this month, which has been named a pilgrimage site. Let us walk with Abraham, Issac and Jacob as we tour the basilica and find hope for our homeland and food for our people. Like Moses and the Israelites, let us hope for freedom in our faith and our families. Like Isiah, Ezekiel, John the Baptist, and even Jonah, let us show that the kingdom of God is at hand. With the 12 apostles, sent out two by two to preach, let us bring that Good News to all that we meet. As we journey through the last half of our Jubilee Year of Hope, may we greet the leper with St. Francis, calm the wolves in our lives, share our cloaks and always sing of the goodness of God's creation, because hope never disappoints.

THE FRUITS OF THE SPIRIT EXEMPLIFIED IN OUR RULE (PART 2)

The Formation Friday article of June 6, 2025, asks us to see how the Gifts of the Holy Spirit are present in our Rule. This month we will reflect on the remaining Gifts of the Spirit.

As a reminder, our Rule:

- Spells out the way the Spirit wishes us to do God's will
- · Tells us how God desires us to live
- Faithfulness to the Rule and Constitutions help us to build up God's Kingdom (as we are called to do through our Baptism).

For your consideration—the Fruits of the Spirit and our Rule

First of all—Articles 4, 14 and 19 ask us to be open to the action of the Holy Spirit. Then:

Long-suffering: Articles 10 and 19

+We follow the "poor and crucified Christ, witness to him even in difficulties and persecutions."

Mildness: Articles 9 and 11

+We live in the "spirit of the Beatitudes."

Faith: Articles 4, 5, 10 and 14

+We express our faith in Jesus: "Christ, the gift of the Father's love, is the way to him, the truth into which the Holy Spirit leads us, and the life which he has come to give abundantly."

OUR RULE of LIFE

Our Rule of Life ends with the following quotation from The Testament of St. Francis:

"May whoever observes all this be filled in heaven

with the blessing of the most high Father,

and on earth with that of his beloved Son.

together with the Holy Spirit, the Comforter."

REFLECTION: In what specific ways do I see living our Rule of Life as a blessing? Take time to thank God today for the gift of vocation to the Secular Franciscan way of life.

THE FRUITS OF THE SPIRIT EXEMPLIFIED IN OUR RULE, Part Two (cont.)

Modesty: Article 11

+We "purify our hearts from every tendency and yearning for possession and power."

Self-restraint: Article 11, 12

+We "acquire purity of heart" in order to "set ourselves free" in order to "love God and our brothers and sisters."

Chastity: Articles 6, 12

+We follow the teachings of the Church, "...devote themselves energetically to living in full communion with the pope, bishops, and priests,..."

For reflection:

- +When people look at you, which fruits of the Holy Spirit are evident? Give an example.
- +How does our Rule help you to demonstrate these fruits of the Spirit?
- +Which fruits of the Spirit would you like to cultivate? Why?
- +Which of the fruits of the Spirit are difficult for you to manifest? Can you pinpoint why that might be?

CANTICLE OF THE CREATURES

We take a break this month from reflections on the Canticle from the Regional Formation team.

Father Christopher Panagoplos, TOR, one of our National Spiritual Assistants, has written a wonderful teaching on the Canticle. We will read it in small pieces so that we can reflect more deeply on his thoughts.

St Francis was no theologian. If we were to ask him what God was, our hope for a learned answer would be dashed. Francis was a witness to the living God. All we can require of such a witness is that he should describe what he experienced, what he heard, saw and felt, assuring us that his experience was not merely fantasy, but a reality that had turned his life around.

So, Francis is a witness when he stands before us as an example of what God can do in us. At the same time, Francis is an acute reminder of God's richness and goodness, for which we hunger. When we make a conscious effort to respond to God, I believe that our lives, too, would be turned around. In this way, Francis shows us clearly that God is present among us, recovering the joy of feeling we are loved with an infinite love. By the working of the Holy Spirit in our lives of faith, we see living proof that authentic humanity flourishes when we are one with God's creation reflecting God's richness and goodness in our lives [Julio Mico, OFM Cap., "The Spirituality of St Francis: Francis' Image of God"].

Approaching the God Francis knew, we touch what is fundamental as we journey through life. Life, in fact all of creation, reflects the presence of God. God is to be praised through all of creation, and is expressed most clearly in "The Canticle of Brother Sun." The sun gives light, and its radiant beauty is for Francis a likeness of God. This sun which shines on the good and bad alike reflects the love and fidelity of God's reconciling love.
