BEING Peace

(Editor's note: As we continue to pray for peace in the Holy Land, Ukraine and all other parts of the world where violence and civil unrest exist, this month we focus on the Franciscan dedication to peace.)

In his Testament, Francis tells us that "the Lord revealed a greeting to me that we should say: 'May the Lord give you peace.'" Saint Bonaventure recalls, "At the beginning and end of every sermon [Francis] announced peace; in every greeting he wished for peace."

Both Francis and Clare greeted the people of Assisi with Pace e Bene! Peace and Good! As Franciscans, peace must be at the center of all our comings and goings.

Pope Emeritus, Benedict XVI says, "Peace concerns the human person as a whole, and it involves complete commitment. It is peace with God through a life lived according to his will. It is interior peace with oneself, and exterior peace with our neighbors and all creation."

He also says, "Like Francis, always start with yourselves. We are the first house that God wants to restore. If you are always able to renew yourselves in the spirit of the Gospel, you will continue to assist the pastors of the Church to make more and more beautiful the Church's face, that of the bride of Christ."


OUR RULE of LIFE

Chapter Two: The Way of Life

Article 8. As Jesus was the true worshipper of the Father, so let prayer and contemplation be the soul of all they are and do. Let them participate in the sacramental life of the Church, above all the Eucharist. Let them join in liturgical prayer in one of the forms proposed by the Church, reliving the mysteries of the life of Christ.

When I first saw Brother Dennis, he was walking around the parking lot of the church in a flannel shirt and a pair of workpants and I wondered if we had hired another sexton. As I got to know him better I came to see what a gentle, joy-filled servant of St. Francis he was.

One of my first experiences with Brother Dennis was following a parish council meeting when one of the members couldn't get his car started. I offered to give him a ride home but to my chagrin, my car wouldn't. Well, the other member quickly found a ride home before everyone else left. Luckily, Brother Dennis came out to be sure everyone was all set. Not only

were cell phones not a life staple back then but Joe was home with 2 kids he would have had to drag out at 9 o'clock at night. Not only did Brother Dennis jump my car but he followed me all the way home to make sure I got there safely.

As I began to get more involved with St. Edwards, I began to get to know the Franciscan friars we were so blessed with. Sure at one point Father Tom cleaned off my car after a particularly snowy Mass. However, one time while I was sitting with Father Richard on the steps of the friary, I looked up to see Brother Dennis washing my car.

When we took a group of young parishioners to World Youth Day 2002, the friars had arranged the use of a local church's grounds so the teens could have one free afternoon to relax. When we arrived and noticed the lawn wasn't mowed, Father Richard turned to me and said if Brother Dennis was there he would be riding the lawn mower.

Another time, my kids helped him stuff the Sunday bulletins - which I'm sure he took a picture of – he wanted to thank them so he went into the friary and got them a jar of peanuts and a bottle of diet coke. The kids were 4 & 10 years old. He often took pictures of my kids for me to send to Joe was he was on active duty for a year.

But that was Brother Dennis – he loved to take care of our grounds, our church, and our parishioners and he did it filled with Franciscan joy.

BEING Peace (cont.)

OFS Rule, Article 14

Secular Franciscans, together with all people of good will, are called to build a more fraternal and evangelical world so that the kingdom of God may be brought about more effectively. Mindful that anyone "who follows Christ, the perfect man, becomes more of a man himself," let them exercise their responsibilities competently in the Christian spirit of service.

OFS General Constitutions, Article 19.1,2

- 1. Rule Paragraph 14 Secular Franciscans should always act as a leaven in the environment in which they live through the witness of their fraternal love and clear Christian motivations.
- 2. In the spirit of minority, they should opt for relationships which give preference to the poor and to those on the fringe of society, whether these be individuals or categories of persons or an entire people; they should collaborate in overcoming the exclusion of others and those forms of poverty that are the fruit of inefficiency and injustice.
