- 1) Old rectory: Jim was approached by a parishioner asking the cost of insurance on the old rectory, Father is looking into those numbers. Many parishioners have expressed there concerns as to when the old rectory will be demolished.
- 2) Mary Sass presented a bid on demolition of the old rectory and garages from Paul Keppler for \$13,500.
- 3) Dave mentioned keeping the heat and electricity on until March 1 2020. This is the deadline to remove items from the old rectory.
- 4) A walk through is set for February 2^{nd} from 11:30 to 1:30 or by formal appointment the week of February 2^{nd} to 8^{th} . Call the office or any council member to set up an appointment.
- 5) The council will draft a letter to inform the parishioners of the walk through. And meet January 22nd to organize the walk through and an extended discussion of the old rectory.
- 6) People interested in salvaging parts of the old rectory will be asked to fill out a form stating what they wish to take and an amount they wish to donate for that item. In the event more than one person wants the same item the higher of the donation will prevail. **Items will have to be removed by March** 1st, 2020.
- 7) Jim is checking to see if we need a permit to take the old rectory down.
- 8) Mary Sass and Dave Sanger will meet with Paul Keppler and Brad Freilinger on demolition and report back on the January 22 meeting for a final decision.

Next Meeting an extended discussion of the old rectory is January 22nd at 5:30 p.m.
