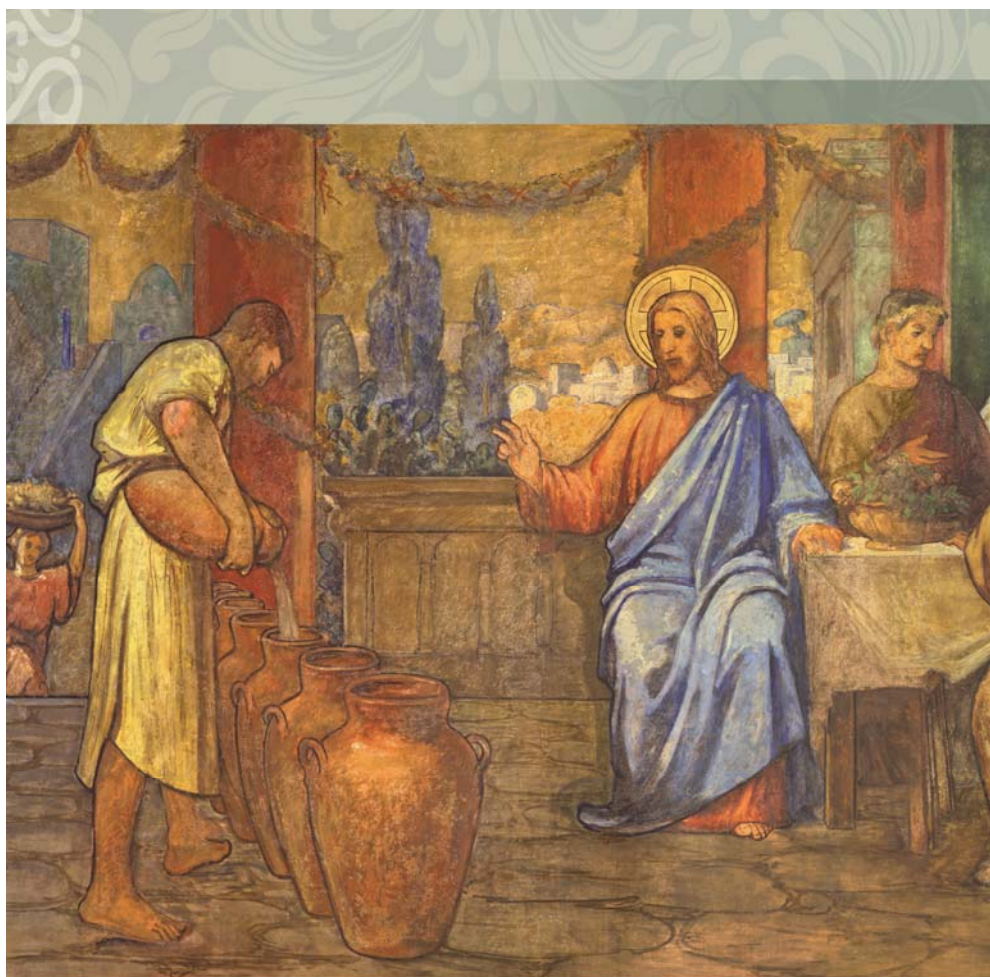

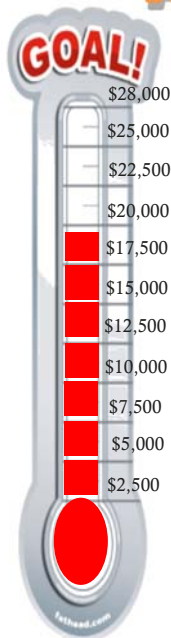

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Question:

What is the story behind the rosary?

Answer:

The rosary is a sacred and popular Catholic devotion, but its origins are mysterious. Prayer beads to facilitate meditation began in the early ages of the Church. In the early medieval period, bead strings were used to count Hail Marys or Our Fathers. A tradition has developed that the rosary in its current form was given to St. Dominic by the Blessed Mother. However, the earliest biographies of the saint do not include this story. In the Middle Ages, the prayers were grouped into 50 Hail Marys with verses from Psalms and vignettes from the lives of Jesus and Mary. By the 16th century, the Joyful, Sorrowful, and Glorious Mysteries were established.

The rosary rose to prominence in the late 1500s. The Turkish Empire was spreading across eastern Europe, and pirates were raiding Christian ships. The Christian nations of Europe rallied for a great battle at sea. Pope St. Pius V urged all Christians to pray the rosary for victory. While vastly outnumbered, the Christian fleet was victorious at the Battle of Lepanto. The pope established October 7th as the feast of the Holy Rosary. Later, all of October would come to be known as the Month of the Rosary.

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

¿Cuánto es Suficiente?

Durante una conversación sobre la buena administración del dinero y el tiempo, mi hija compartió que a veces hacer lo mejor era muy difícil para ella. No siempre era una cuestión de lo correcto y lo incorrecto, blanco y negro, sino de lo que es mejor y lo que es aun mejor. Comencé a reflexionar sobre la verdad de su declaración. Cuando nos enfrentamos a una decisión, a veces se nos puede dar la opción de lo bueno, lo mejor, y lo aun mejor. Nos engañamos a nosotros mismos creyendo que elegir lo bueno no es una mala elección, por lo que debe ser suficiente. Sin embargo, esencialmente hemos puesto un límite a nuestra generosidad o compromiso con nuestro falso sentido de buena administración.

Jesús nos llama de diferentes maneras todos los días. A veces el costo para nosotros es claro. Sin embargo, a veces no hay una métrica clara. Cuando somos llamados a amar, ¿cuánto amor es suficiente? Cuando alguien necesita nuestro tiempo, ¿cuántas horas son suficientes? Cuando un regalo pequeño produce un resultado positivo, ¿qué podría lograr un regalo más grande?

No te dejes engañar por la enseñanza de Jesús sobre la semilla de mostaza. Él estaba hablando a aquellos que estaban atrapados en preocupaciones de su estatus, incertidumbre de corazón y falta de fe verdadera. Jesús enseñó con parábolas y luego demostró verdadera fe y generosidad con su crucifixión. Quizás la fe de semilla de mostaza nos permita mover montañas y árboles para que podamos ver hasta el horizonte de la cruz. En la cruz, encontramos la verdadera métrica de amor y generosidad que es para todos los que lo siguen a Él.

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

Los tiempos que se están viviendo en la sociedad actual con referencia a la injusticia y la facilidad para la violencia son alarmantes. Los medios de comunicación muestran todos los días el cómo se quita la vida humana, la destrucción del planeta, de las plantas y animales. La primera lectura del Profeta Habacuc, su reclamo a Dios en su tiempo es un reflejo del nuestro: “¿Por qué me haces ver la injusticia?” ¿Acaso no estamos cansados de todo lo que vemos y escuchamos? Tal pareciera que Dios no escucha ni interviene en la miseria humana. Pero no, no es así. Dios responde e invita al Profeta a escribir su visión: “*El que vacila nunca contará con mi favor, el justo si vivirá por su fidelidad.*” (Habacuc 2:4). Los eventos de la vida del ser humano están en los planes de Dios. Depende de nosotros la fidelidad y el compromiso. ¿Estás de acuerdo con el Profeta? ¿En qué sentido?

El Evangelio, por otro lado, nos muestra la forma de alinearnos con la gente buena para hacer cosas que ayuden a la sociedad a crecer en justicia y promover la paz. Esa paz que tanto se necesita en las fronteras del mundo, con los refugiados y los que caminan en caravana dejando sus países. Sin embargo, el punto principal de todo es la fe. Por eso, los apóstoles piden que se aumente su fe. El Maestro responde y da ejemplos palpables para llegar hasta mover montañas y agrega lo siguiente: “*Así también ustedes, cuando hayan hecho todo lo que les ha sido mandado, digan: Somos servidores que no hacíamos falta, hemos hecho lo que era nuestro deber.*” (Lucas 17:10).

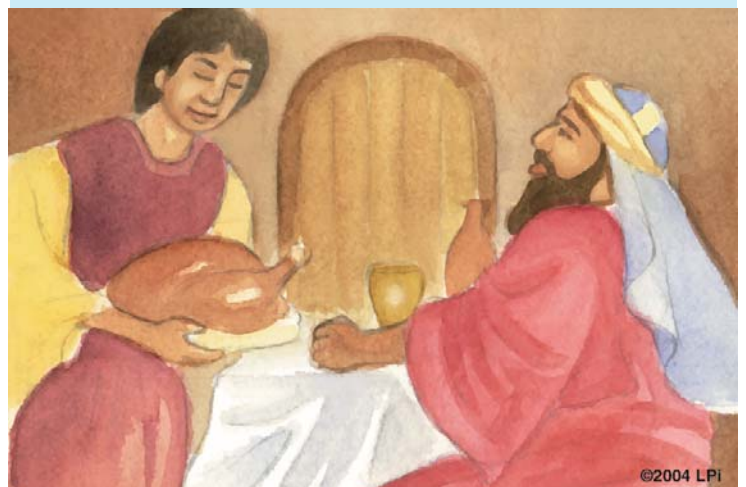
