## What brought you to St. B's? Why do you stay?

When we lived in South Carolina, we were not involved in our parish community; however, when we moved to Japan we found community in our parish Church. So when we moved to San Diego, finding a parish community was important to me. And

#### Who has influenced your faith journey?

### How have you been growing in faith lately?

To do that, I took time away from activities like watching tv or listening to the radio while driving.

#### What is your favorite type of prayer?

The rosary—although this type of prayer has always been important to me, my relationship has changed with Mother Mary now that I have kids. I can better relate to her as a mother and what she must have gone through watching her Son on the cross. I also say the guardian angel prayer over my boys in the morning before they wake up.

### How do you show God's love through service?
