Although the place where they currently live as seen in the “before” picture seems relatively livable as far as Haitian standards go, the outer walls were crumbling, the dirt floor turns to mud in the rainy season and there were no walls inside to offer any degree of privacy. Because of Mr. Luckner’s hard work ethic, especially in regards to helping his neighbors in the community, and that of his wife and children, the selection committee decided that they would be the recipients of one of the three houses built during the birthday month of Rebecca Claire Fakier.
