On the Road to 100 houses by May 2017!

Can you believe it!! Our Haiti Mission family has done what very few governments, organizations or churches have done – By May 2nd (God Willing!) we will have built 100 houses. That is 100 families, hundreds of extended families and only God knows how many men, women and children have been taken out of misery and given a new, safe and secure home to live in. Below is pictured Edna Bazard who received the miracle in March. Over and over, two and sometimes three times a month, the miracle happens because of our perseverance and prayerful persistence. God hears the prayer of the poor and continues to touch us all in some way so that this continues to come together. This is what Christianity is all about. This is what Lent calls us to do. This has been the best Lent ever for some very desperate folks in Haiti; so that means its been the best Lent ever for you!! Thanks again for hanging in with us!



Edna Bazard has had five children but only one living with her now since her physically challenged body and desperately dire situation has forced her to place them with other friends and families. The Christmas 2016 HMI team visited her while assessing the damage caused by Hurricane Matthew. Seeing these circumstances and learning her story caused them to begin doing what they could to get her into a new home as soon as practical. Thank God for all who helped in any way to help this woman and her family.

And then there were Two!

Transportation and vehicles are always a problem in Haiti. What they call roads there we would identify as a ravine, a cow path, a rock slide, etc. Needless to say vehicles are literally destroyed in a very short period of time and tires get a quarter or less of the usage there as they do here because of the treacherous conditions. In 2010, HMI, in conjunction with Cycle World in Houma, was able to purchase and ship a diesel powered Kawasaki Mule to Haiti. To say that this has been a blessing would be a gross understatement. The “Mule” is designed to operate in those types of situations much better than most any other type of 4 wheel drive vehicle. For seven years now HMI has been sending repair parts as needed. The parts are only as good as the mechanic who uses them. However, we have been especially blessed to have Rudy Soignet, a factory trained technician with Cycle World for 41 years go down to Haiti at least once a year to do routine and high tech maintenance and train our Haitian team to do routine maintenance. Because of Rudy, this piece of equipment has been running virtually every day for seven years transporting people and supplies all over our service area in and around Jeremie. Now that we have more teams going down to visit and help out and now that we are also drilling much more, the pressure on our Mule is intense. So to speak, we are almost at the proverbial point where one more straw will break its back. As we pondered how to most efficiently solve the problem, it dawned on us that another Mule just like the one we had would be the most cost effective and practical solution! We have spare parts down there already. The Haitians already know how to do most of the maintenance on the unit. Let’s just buy another good quality used one, have Rudy restore it and send it down. That’s what you are looking at in the picture with Rudy and his worthy and capable assistant Darryl Schonacher welcoming the new arrival to our “fleet” of Mules. We have great hopes for this Mule. It is fixing to be put through the paces as any good mule should be. It will be a blessing. Thanks Rudy and Darryl because without you, nothing like this can happen. Go to work Mule!!
