Journey of Faith

The HMI/Haiti story has been a journey of faith; an amazing odyssey of convoluted lines that has entangled loving people hungry to help those in need with a simple invitation to "hear the cry of the poor" (Prv 21:13) It has caught up not only individuals but entire communities. The following is the testimony of Liz Sams from the beautiful parish of St. Mary Magdalene in Apex, N.C. What a blessing her band of "helpers of the poor" have been!

In April 2018 two women who serve as youth ministers from St. Mary Magdalene Catholic Church in Apex, NC (www.stmm.church) took their first international mission trip with HMI to Jeremie, Haiti. They were invited on this trip by their good friend Fr. Dave Pivonka, TOR who

had gathered a group of people to personally experience the complexity of life in Haiti. With no expectations, the women set off on this journey open to whatever the Lord had in store for them and by the end of the trip they knew clearly their mission was to build a bridge between the community in Jeremie to their own community back home in Apex, NC. Their hearts were deeply impacted by the great faith, joy, and strength of the people they encountered that week. They made a goal to fundraise enough money to build one house with HMI's matching program. For the 2018-2019 school year their teens and families raised money and were able to successfully build one house in Haiti which was done in honor of their pastor, Fr. Donald Staib. In linking with our K-8 St. Mary Magdalene school, we were also able to raise the funds to keep the school open for the 2019-2020 school year! The people of the church and the school showed tremendous generosity!

But they felt called to do more. They knew the biggest challenge was how to accurately convey to their parishioners just how great the need was and to show there was great value in assisting HMI & the school. So, a plan was formulated amongst the church and school to ask if there was anyone from their community who would like to go on a mission trip with HMI in April 2019 and two people

said yes! When they returned, they sat down with leaders from the church and school and committed to fundraising for the HMI house building project and to get the school expenses covered for the 2020-2021 school year as well. They invited Fr. Joe to come visit their church and school for a few days. What a success that was to get everyone on board and deepening the relationship with our friends in Haiti. Over the course of the 2019-2020 school year the school and church communities raised enough funds to build seven houses and to keep the school open for the 2020-2021 school year!! Liz Sams

A wonderful and unforgettable visit at St Mary Magdalene Parish in Apex, NC

A year in advance, I received an invitation to visit St Mary Magdalene Parish in Apex, N.C. from the pastor Fr. Donald Staib through Liz Sams. Liz was a member of the first delegation from N.C. that had ever visited our parish. As the date of the visit approached, Liz sent me another message advising my trip's tickets were on the way and to confirm the invitation. I understood it as a call from God to definitely and firmly create that bridge between the two parish communities and schools.

After a long day of travel from Jeremie to lovely Apex, I was picked up at the airport by Liz and Janine McGann who with her husband Mike, were to be my hosts at their home which turned out to be such a peaceful and prayerful place. During my entire stay, I was spoiled by the McGanns. May the Lord shower on them and their dwelling place a rain of blessings!

The next day, I met Fr Staib before the 8:15 AM mass. The encounter was so delightful. Although Fr. has a rather strict demeanor, he welcomed me in a very kind, warm and fraternal way, making the welcome even more pleasant by having dinner with us at the McGanns on Friday evening.

In order to allow me to better communicate with the parish faithful, Father offered me to preside at and deliver the homily at all masses from Friday morning to Sunday evening. I was particularly struck by the impressive number of faithful that showed up at each mass in a State known to be predominantly protestant. People were very kind and took time to talk to me after each mass.

My visit was both to express in person the deepest gratitude of my parishioners to the school kids and SMM community for their generous contribution to support the school and home building efforts initiated and conducted by HMI in the parish of Numero Deux (Jeremie/Haiti) and encourage them to continue supporting any fundraising effort towards these ends.

Though I had a very busy schedule during my visit at SMM from saying masses, talking to school kids, groups of young people preparing for the sacrament of confirmation or else, I felt however energized by the faith and dedication of all those women and men who try their utmost best to witness to the love of Jesus Christ and pass it on to the next generation. I was particularly overjoyed by the conversations I had with the kids at the school.

As a former chancellor of the diocese of Jeremie who was used to go abroad for mission appeals, I consider my visit to Apex as one of the most interesting experiences I ever had in my more than three decades of priesthood. I think that the bridge we have built based upon love for the neediest of the needy must be strengthened by all means. I leave it to HMI's board of directors and SMM's parish council to determine the best way to achieve that goal for God's glory and the betterment of humanity!
