Lemons to Lemonade

The old adage, "When life gives you lemons, make lemonade," has always been a part of the HMI journey. Virtually every challenge and seeming defeat has eventually been turned into a blessing that we could not see in the moment. It seems that 2021 is presenting us with a huge lemon tree. No matter what problems have arisen, never has there been a time when we couldn't somehow eventually return to Haiti. Jan 26, 2021 began an international travel advisory that seemed to finally halt our ingenuity and determination to get back to our friends in Haiti. As you may know by the time you receive this newsletter, to travel internationally, you must have a negative COVID-19 test within three days of embarking both ways. Since simply being able to schedule flights in and out of Haiti has been challenging, adding any additional hoop to go through would almost destroy the window of opportunity, but one of this magnitude is like turning the mole hill into a mountain.

The good news is that we have been (unintentionally probably but providentially surely) preparing for this day for the past twenty years. We have developed a simple but efficient and effective system of transferring funds directly to Fr. Joe in an accountability process that assures transparency and security. Until we can go back to Haiti our system allows us to continue without interruption to respond to the cry of the poor by continuing to build houses, drill and repair water wells and do some of the other humanitarian objectives that we do on mission trips.

A bump in the road doesn't stop our journey. Enjoy the lemonade!

The Impact of Haiti Mission Inc. on my life - The Emerson Rodrigue story

Growing up my dad was an interpreter for Haiti mission which inspired me to want to be one too. It is my biggest dream to become an interpreter at the highest level possible. When I was born, my dad asked Deacon Lloyd to be my God father. I could not ask for a better God father. It helped me so much and opened a lot of opportunities for me. My dad ended up getting a Visa to travel to the US around 2008. That was like the coolest thing for a Haitian like me to be able to go to school and being able to tell my friends that my dad can go to the United States. It is like a big accomplishment, so I became the cool kid in my school just because my dad can go to the US. In 2010 a terrible thing happened to Haiti - the earthquake. Haiti was going through the worse time in their History. We could not go to school because they were all destroyed. There was nothing left. Still to this day you can find people in Haiti that were affected by the earthquake. HMI continued to come to Haiti. They always go to Jeremie. I did not have school at the time, I went with them. I watched how helpful my dad was and how much both the Haiti mission members and the Haitians appreciated the work my dad was doing to make their communication easier; I tried to help in the best way I possibly could. It was very rewarding and enjoyable. In that same year, Dad and I went to the US embassy and applied for a visa for me. Thanks be to God I got it and now I was even cooler when I went back to school because not only my dad could go to the United States but I could too! I came here to the US and saw how much better and different everything was compared to Haiti and I loved it! Everyone was very friendly. I even went to a few schools where I sang some Haitian songs and talked about life in Haiti. It was awesome! Everybody around me was very nice and treated me and my dad like we were part of a family. I started coming every year and that made me the most popular and coolest in both schools that I went to in Haiti. In 2012 my mom split and she left the house which was one of the worse periods of my life. My sisters and

I had to go live at my aunt's house. They were nice people but it just was not the same. It did not feel like a family, but it was what we had to do. I helped take care of my sisters until everything was settled so we could go back and live with my dad. Through it all, my dad took care of us. We could not ask for a better dad. By the end of my junior year in high school, we planned that I was going to move to the US live with the family that I always went to every summer that I went to the United States. They made me feel like I was home. They treated me like I was one of their own. I really appreciated and felt so blessed to have them in my life. It would not have been possible to meet them if it was not for Haiti Mission. Everything ended up working out so wonderfully! It was not an easy route but they did everything that was possible to make it happen and I'm very thankful of that. I ultimately went to the US embassy in Haiti and got a five year Student Visa which is very rare. It was truly a miracle which I thank God every day for. I finished my senior year of high school at St Mary's Catholic school in Natchitoches and am now going to college at Northwestern State University where I am getting closer to realizing my dream of becoming an interpreter - not just like my dad - but even better. I want to become an interpreter at the highest level. Haiti Mission has had a tremendous impact on me and my family. I am blessed for that. I cannot wait to get back to my family and my country and help them in every way that I can possibly can.


