## Chateau – Well # 10

This well is located in a remote area to the East of Jeremie. The pump installation in July, 2011 completed the final phase of this lengthy but much needed project. The well furnishes water for the department of transportation compound, two elementary schools in the immediate area and the surrounding community. The completion of this project which was to purchase and install the pump was sponsored by Rotary District 6200. Below is a pictorial of the various phases of the Chateau well project.

## PHASE #3 – December 2015

The chateau project to drill a fresh water well and install an electric submersible pump was initiated in January 2009 by HMI in association with Rotary District #6200 in order to furnish water for a school there and a public fountain constructed by HMI. The only requirement HMI made was that the electricity be furnished by a government agency. For several years the Department of transportation fulfilled that directive but when policies and directorships changed in the area, the electricity was discontinued so the region was once again without a readily available water supply. HMI continued to negotiate and request that the electricity once again be supplied. It is with great joy that we are able to show pictures of the water flowing once again as the latest director has once again complied with the original agreement re-commencing in December 2015.
