

BREAD FROM HEAVEN

When the Israelites came out of Egypt, God did one miracle after another for them. He got water from a rock when they were thirsty; and, when they were hungry, he fed them with bread from heaven. “*Mah nah?* —what is this?” the Israelites asked when they saw it; and ‘manna’ has been its name ever since. Why didn’t God just miraculously produce real, ordinary bread for them?

Moses answers this question in his speech to the people: God fed them with manna so that they might know one does not live by bread alone. If God had fed them ordinary bread, they would not have learned the lesson. As it was, first they hungered, and then they were fed miraculously with the who-knows-what-this-is bread from heaven. And so they learned to trust in God, who fed them with what they needed to live. But this is only half the lesson, as Moses explains it: one does not live by bread alone; what else is needed is the word of God.

And so, when the time was right, the only-begotten Word of God came so that people might not perish but have ever-lasting life (John 3:16). That is why Christ said that he was the true bread from heaven. One does not live by bread alone but by this true Word of God. And, by a miracle which completes the lesson of the manna, this Word is the bread of life for all the faithful. The Word of God and the bread from heaven are present in one here. In the Eucharist, then, there is everything that one needs to live, if one will only learn the lesson and trust in Christ, who feeds his people with himself, the living bread from heaven and the Word of God.

Welcome back to Mass!

We have been informed by Archbishop Cordileone that all parishes and other worship sites in the Archdiocese may resume public Mass beginning on Sunday, June 14, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. With joy and faith, Notre Dame des Victoires will reopen public Masses. Please review the Interim Schedule of Masses during the Corona Virus Pandemic. Be prepared to cooperate with the principles set forth by the City Health Department and the Archdiocese of San Francisco.

Our Mass schedule will start slowly as we reopen Public Masses at NDV.

We will celebrate only 3 Masses On Sundays:

9 a.m., 10:30 a.m. in French and 12:15 p.m.

Weekday Masses: only the 7 a.m. Monday - Friday.

No Masses on Saturdays.

Guidelines for the Resumption of Public Worship

1. All the faithful in the Archdiocese of San Francisco are dispensed from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass. Although the faithful are dispensed from their obligation to attend Mass, they must observe the Lord's Day and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday (such as following a livestream Mass or participating in a spiritual or corporal act of mercy).
2. Those who are at higher risk of COVID-19 (e.g., those who are older or who have underlying health conditions) are to continue staying at home. Likewise, anyone with a cough of any sort, and anyone feeling ill, should not come to the church.
3. We will not hold events before or after Masses until directed by the Archdiocese.
4. We will have a team of Ushers and parishioners are to follow their directions before and during Mass.
5. In charity to all and in consideration of public health and safety, those attending Mass must wear a mask. All faithful able to do so are asked to bring their own hand sanitizer and mask. We will provide a limited supply of masks and hand sanitizer. Your temperature might be taken with a touchless thermometer.
6. The six-foot distance rule will be strictly enforced. Pews will be cordoned off to insure a minimum of six feet between pews in which people will be sitting. Blue tape will be on the floor to ensure distance when entering/leaving the church and coming forward for Communion. Members of a single household do not need to practice physical distancing with each other and so may sit together in the same row.
7. All liturgical aids (e.g., song books/ have been removed from the church.
8. There will be no entrance or exit processions to begin or end Mass.
9. Understanding that a certain sense of apprehensiveness and anxiety may exist, you may refrain from receiving Holy Communion if you desire. Those who choose not to receive are encouraged to make a "Spiritual Communion."
10. The collection baskets will be placed in the rear of the church. Please drop off your donation before or after Mass.


