SETTING OUR NAVIGATION SYSTEM TOWARD GOD

Lent is a time of grace for us, a time to open ourselves more to God and to the gifts that God wants to give to us. People talk about doing all sorts of things for Lent and about giving up things. These are all good in themselves, but Lent is above all about opening ourselves to God. The things that we do and the things that we give up are to help us open ourselves more to God. Lent is about opening ourselves more to God and to the grace that he wants to give to us.

Lent is our time to consider the path we are on and if there is anything we need to do to be more centered on the path to God. It is the time to "repent and believe in the Gospel" as we heard Jesus say in today's Gospel passage (Mark 1:15). It seems like the whole of the world has been on a path these past weeks dancing to a song in the Zulu language called Jerusalema. It is a spiritual song that says that "my place is not here" (Ndawo yami ayikho lana) and "my kingdom is not here" (Mbuso wami awukho lana) and "Jerusalem is my [spiritual] home" (Jerusalema ikhava lami). Lent is our time to set our path towards the heavenly Jerusalem, the kingdom of God, because our place is not here, and our kingdom is not here.

Lent is a journey that involves our whole life, our entire being. It is a time to reconsider the path we are taking, to find the route that leads us home, and to rediscover our profound relationship with God, on whom everything depends. Lent is not just about the little sacrifices we make, but about discerning where our hearts are directed.

Lent is a time of grace for us, a time for us to open ourselves more to God and to the gifts that God wants to give us. Again and again in the New Testament, we read beautiful invitations from Jesus to us such as, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will enter his house and dine with him, and he with me." (Rev 3:20) During this Lent, with the help of our guardian angels, may we hear Jesus knocking, open, let him in, and dine with him!

FRENCH CORNER

Convertissez-vous et croyez à la Bonne Nouvelle

Aujourd'hui, comme ce ne sont plus les adultes mais les enfants qui reçoivent le baptême, le premier objectif a perdu de son importance, mais le second reste toujours valable. Le carême est pour chacun et chacune d'entre nous l'occasion de renouveler notre engagement chrétien en alimentant notre foi à la parole de Dieu et en nous rappelant que «nous ne vivons pas seulement de pain». (Mt 4, 4) Pendant ces quarante jours, le Christ nous invite à nous joindre à sa «révolution», une révolution intérieure qui commence en chacun et chacune de nous.

L'essentiel de ce processus de conversion est de nous attacher à la personne du Christ. Une fois ce lien établi, nous pouvons plus facilement lutter contre le mal. On connaît bien la «conversion» de saint Paul. Il n'était pas un grand pécheur, bien au contraire car, selon la loi juive, il était un homme irréprochable, mais il a adhéré à Jésus Christ, et cela a bouleversé sa vie.

Pendant ce temps de préparation à la fête de Pâques, l'Église nous propose trois moyens pour raviver la flamme de notre engagement chrétien : le jeûne, la prière et le partage.

En ce premier dimanche de carême, j'aimerais mettre l'accent sur le jeûne, un élément qui n'est pas très populaire dans notre civilisation de consommation mais qui demeure un des piliers de toute spiritualité authentique.

C'est surtout pendant les périodes plus difficiles que le jeûne peut nous aider à redimensionner nos priorités et nos objectifs de vie.

Le jeûne est un moyen efficace pour nous aider à trouver une alternative aux valeurs de notre monde de consommation, de cupidité et d'injustice. L'argent que nous épargnons sur les loisirs, la nourriture, le magasinage, le luxe peut être partagé avec d'autres. Notre temps et nos talents peuvent venir en aide à ceux et celles dans le besoin : «Chaque fois que vous l'avez fait à l'un de ces petits qui sont mes frères, c'est à moi que vous l'avez fait» (Mt 25, 31-46) Père Yvon-Michel Allard, S.V.D.

First Sunday of Lent

Today's readings remind us why we partake in this 40-day Lenten journey — to prepare our hearts for the resurrection of Christ on Easter.

St. Peter reminds us in our Second Reading of the blessings we receive from Christ's passion, death, and resurrection — "Christ suffered for sins once... that he might lead you to God." And again, "[Baptism] is... an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ."

To receive the blessings more readily from Christ's passion, death, and resurrection, we too are called to endure 40 days "in the desert." In our Gospel, Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert where He was tempted by Satan. Jesus was called to face trials and to confront evil. During this time, He committed to intense prayer and fasting. It was not necessary for Jesus to go into the desert so that He might be purified, but rather, to endure the temptations of man for our sake. He was fully man, and experienced temptations just like us, yet responded to them perfectly, never falling into sin.

We should strive to fully participate in this Lenten season by mirroring Jesus, the model steward by Whom we are called to imitate. Through our time in the desert, we will confront evil by weeding out the roots of sin in our lives through fasting. And we will be sustained and nourished in the desert by prayer.

Let us strive to purify our hearts so that we might be ready to receive the glorious gift of Christ and partake in the riches that pour forth from this Gift.

Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: February 20, 2024

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE ARCHDIOCESE OF SAN FRANCISCO

On August 21, 2023, The Roman Catholic Archbishop of San Francisco, a California corporation sole, aka Archdiocese of San Francisco (the "Debtor"), filed for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code").

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Debtor, you must file a claim so as to be received by February 20, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Debtor.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Debtor that occurred before August 21, 2023, must be filed on or before February 20, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before August 21, 2023.
