
#### **EASTER JOY**

The Psalm for Easter Sunday says. "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." Above all days, Easter is a day of joy. But what is joy? The answer St. Francis gave to this question is famous. St. Francis said to his Brother Leo, "When we come to St. Mary of the Angels [our house], soaked by the rain and frozen by the cold, all soiled with mud and suffering from hunger, and we ring at the gate of the place and the brother porter comes and says angrily: 'Who are you?' And we say: 'We are two of your brothers.' And ... he does not open for us, but makes us stand outside in the snow and rain, cold and hungry, until night falls-then if we endure all those insults and cruel rebuffs patiently, ... oh, Brother Leo, ... perfect joy is there!" \*

Whatever we may think of St. Francis's explanation of perfect joy, Easter reminds us that Francis's kind of joy is not the end of the story. At Easter, we celebrate the other kind of joy, the kind each of us longs for, when every tear is wiped away, and there is no sorrow anymore—no more suffering from weather or hunger or hurtful human beings. As we sing in the much-loved hymn by Fr. John Foley, SJ, at Easter there is only "the cross and passion past; dark night is done, bright morning come at last!"\*\*

When we ourselves rise to meet our risen Lord, in that bright morning we will hear the Lord say, "Come away, beloved. The winter is past; the rain is gone, and the flowers return to the earth" (Song of Songs 2:10-12). In the loving union of that encounter, all the heartbrokenness of our lives will be redeemed. That will be perfect joy. If all we had was the joy St. Francis describes, our courage might fail us in this life. Easter celebrates now the perfect joy waiting for us when we and all creation are reborn with our resurrected Lord into the everlasting love of God. This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

#### FRENCH CORNER

"Le Seigneur est ressuscité, alléluia, alléluia"

Pâques est la plus grande fête chrétienne de l'année. C'est la fête de la vie, du printemps, du renouveau, de la joie. La fête de Pâques ouvre une tout autre perspective sur la vie et sur la mort.

Ce qui distingue les chrétiens des non croyants c'est la résurrection, c'est la foi et la confiance en un Dieu qui refuse de mettre un terme à la vie et qui n'accepte pas que tout se termine au cimetière. D'ailleurs, le mot que les chrétiens utilisaient pour indiquer l'endroit où ils enterraient leurs défunts est «cimetière» et qui voulait dire «hôtel pour visiteurs étrangers», «auberge de passage».

Notre foi chrétienne ne se limite pas à nous rappeler que le Christ est ressuscité et que notre vie ne se termine pas avec la mort. La Pâque et la résurrection ramènent un nouveau printemps après un hiver meurtrier et glacial. Elles nous incitent à nous engager maintenant, à prendre la vie au sérieux. Le Christ nous invite à vivre pleinement dès maintenant, à sortir de nos tombeaux, de nos découragements, de nos craintes et de nos peurs. «Sortez de vos tombeaux, de vos vies sans espérance. Recommencez à respirer à pleins poumons...» «Je suis venu pour que vous ayez la vie et que vous l'ayez en abondance».

Aujourd'hui, nous fêtons la plus grande fête chrétienne de l'année, la fête de Pâques. Le Christ ressuscité nous redonne le courage de rentrer dans nos familles, dans notre milieu de travail, pour y vivre le printemps de Dieu. En ce premier jour de la semaine, en ce jour de la résurrection du Seigneur, Joyeuses Pâques à tous. « Le Seigneur est ressuscité, alléluia, alléluia ».
