I. Options for the Celebration of the Order of Christian Funeral

A. Locations Depending upon Availability

- 1. St. Genevieve Church (StG) at 1683 Sorel St in Centerville
- 2. St. Genevieve Parish-St. John Site (StJ) at 14383 Forest Blvd N in Hugo
- 3. Parish Community Center (PCC) at 6995 Centerville Rd in Centerville

B. Type of Funeral

- 1. Mass with body present
- 2. Mass with cremated remains present
- 3. Mass with body present and cremation later
- 4. Memorial Service without Mass at the Funeral Home
- 5. Memorial Service without Mass at the church
- 6. Memorial Service at graveside.

C. Funeral Date and Time

1. Date of Funerals:

This is dependent on the schedule of the family, funeral homes, priest and building availability.

- 2. Usual Times for Funerals:
 - a. 10:00 am
 - b. 11:00 am
- 3. Visitation Time:

There may be a visitation at the site of the funeral one hour before the funeral.

4. Access to the building will be available two hours before the funeral.

II. Funeral Costs

The church asks for a donation of \$400 to help cover costs of a Mass or Memorial Service with music and a donation of \$200 to help cover costs of a Memorial Service without music. This amount is often collected by the Funeral Home. If a family finds this amount burdensome, we ask the family to make a contribution for whatever they can afford. There is no requested donation for a graveside service.

III. What the Church Does Provide

- Cantor and accompanist please note staff accompanist and cantor are required.
- Funeral Sacristan, Ushers and Eucharistic Ministers
- One hour visitation immediately before the Funeral
- Doors open 45 minutes before visitation or funeral (if no visitation)

IV. What the Church Can Provide If Requested

Upon request (call the Parish Office at 651-429-7937 at least one business day before the funeral), the Church can provide

- live streaming of the service (PCC only)
- small table or stand for guest book
- easels (up to 3 @ PCC; 2 @ StG/StJ) for picture boards
- tables (up to 3 @ PCC; 1 @ StG/StJ) for flowers & memorabilia
- stands (up to 2) for flower arrangements
- early access to building

V. Considerations if You Do Not Employ a Funeral Home

Funeral Homes take care of a lot of details surrounding a funeral. If you do not employ a Funeral Home, please arrange for:

- A basket or box for cards
- Determine who will carry the urn
- Determine who will arrange any flowers / memorabilia

You may also want to consider and arrange for these items:

- a written and published obituary
- Mass programs
- Memorial cards and envelopes
- a guest book
- pens
- volunteer to run slideshow / arrange memorabilia
- extra easels or plant stands
- facial tissues for pews / chairs
- copies of readings or prayers at the funeral site
- escort to the burial site

VI. Options for Funeral Luncheon & Cost

- A. It is a ministry of St. Genevieve's Council of Catholic Women to coordinate a funeral luncheon after consulting with the family. CCW members purchase food, prepare and serve the meal with remaining food sent home with the family. The CCW requests payment for the food purchased following the luncheon. (See Appendix D for Funeral Luncheon Menu Information)
- B. Catered Funeral Luncheon:

Sometimes a family chooses to have the meal catered and served by the funeral luncheon committee. The family is then responsible for ordering the meal and having it delivered to the dining room. The funeral luncheon committee would then serve the meal.

C. Combination of Catered Main Entrée & Provided Salads and Desserts:

Some families chose to have the meat catered and the other items provided by the funeral luncheon committee

VII. Family Involvement in Planning Process

Families are invited to be involved with choosing the music and readings for the funeral. They will meet with the Pastor prior to the funeral; he will assist the family in selecting the readings. Families, relatives and friends are often involved as lectors, gift bearers, pall bearers, giving a short reflection, and assisting with the placement of the pall. We work with the family in making the funeral a celebration of the person's life in light of our faith and belief in the resurrection.

VIII. Burial

- A. Burial at St. Genevieve or St. John the Baptist cemetery usually occurs immediately after the funeral. If the option of a funeral with the body present and cremation later was chosen, then the burial of the cremains is done at a later date.
- B. Burial at another cemetery is scheduled by the Funeral Home and that cemetery. If a burial is to take place at another cemetery, the luncheon usually occurs immediately after the Funeral.
- C. Burial of cremated remains is recommended by the Catholic Church in a cemetery or placed in a columbarium or mausoleum.

IX. Cemetery Costs

A. Grave Sales: (includes \$200 p	perpetual care fee)

Cremation (Parishioner)	\$500
Cremation (Non-Parishioner)	\$700

B. Interment Fees:

Casket Interment	\$1000
winter surcharge (Nov 15 - Apr 15)	+\$240
Saturday surcharge	+\$450

Cremation Interment	\$350
winter surcharge (Nov 15 – Apr 15)	+\$150
Saturday surcharge	+\$100
Vault (not required)	+\$100
larger urn (greater than 12" cube)	+\$100

Checks are made payable to St. Genevieve Church when making payment for grave site or interment at either St. Genevieve Cemetery or St. John the Baptist Cemetery. Payment is due upon purchase and/or burial.

Internments are done Monday – Saturday 9am-2pm.

Appendix B: SUGGESTIONS FOR FUNERAL READINGS

- 1. Suggested First Readings
 - a. A reading from the **Prophet Micah** (Mi.6: 6, 8)

With what gift shall I come into the Lord's presence and bow down before God on high? Shall I come with holocausts and sacrifices?

What is good has been explained to you, this is what the Lord asks of you: only this, to act with justice, to love tenderly, and to walk humbly with God.

The Word of the Lord.

b. A reading from the **Prophet Isaiah** (Isaiah 43: 1-5)

But now, says the Lord, who created you, who formed you. Do not be afraid, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name, you are mine. Should you pass through the sea, I will be with you; or through rivers, they will not swallow you up. Should you walk through fire, you will not be scorched and the flames will not burn you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. You are precious in my eyes, you are honored and I love you. Do not be afraid, for I am with you.

The Word of the Lord.

c. A reading from the **Book of Wisdom** (Wisdom 4: 7-15)

The virtuous person, though they die early, shall be at rest. Length of days is not what makes age honorable, nor number of years the true measure of life; rather understanding is the crown of humanity, and a virtuous life, this is ripe old age. The person who sought to please God, God loved. Coming to perfection in a short while, they achieved long life, for their souls were pleasing to the Lord. The people saw but found this all hard to understand, for they did not take into account, that grace and mercy await the chosen

of the Lord, and protection, God's holy ones.

d. A reading from the **Prophet Isaiah** (Isaiah 43: 1B-3)

Do not be afraid, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name, you are mine. Should you pass through the sea, I will be with you; or through rivers, they will not swallow you up. Should you walk through fire, you will not be scorched and the flames will not burn you. For I am Yahweh, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.

2. Suggested Second Readings

a. A reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans (Rm. 8:31, 38-39)

With God on our side who can be against us? Since God did not spare his own Son, but gave Him up to benefit us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that God will not refuse anything He can give.

I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels or demons, neither the present not the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, no anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Word of the Lord.

b. A reading from **Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians** (1 Cor. 13: 4-13)

Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; Love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offense, and it is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes. Love does not come to an end. We are seeing a dim reflection in a mirror but when the perfect comes we shall be seeing face to face. The knowledge that I have now is imperfect; but then I shall know as fully as I am known. In short, there are three things that last; Faith, Hope and Love, and the greatest of these is Love.

c. A reading from **Paul's First Letter to the Ephesians** (Eph. 2: 4-10)

But God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ (by grace you have been saved), raised us up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God; it is not from works, so no one may boast. For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them.

3. Suggested Gospel Readings

a. A reading from the Gospel of Matthew (Matt. 5: 1-12a)

When Jesus saw the crowds he went up on the Mountainside. After He had sat down His disciples gathered around Him, and He began to teach them.

"How blest are the poor in spirit: the reign of God is theirs. Blest too are the sorrowing: they shall be consoled. Blest are they who hunger and thirst for holiness; they shall have their fill. Blest are they who show mercy; mercy shall be theirs. Blest are the single-hearted for they shall see God. Blest too are the peacemakers; they shall be called children of God Blest are those persecuted for holiness' sake; the reign of God is theirs. Blest are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of slander against you because of me; Be glad and rejoice, for your reward is great in heaven

b. A reading from the Gospel of John (John 14: 1-6)

Jesus said to His disciples:

"Do not let your hearts be troubles. Have faith in God ad faith in Me. In My Father's house there are many dwelling places; otherwise, how could I have told you that I was going to prepare a place for you? I am indeed going to prepare a place for you, and then I shall come back to take you with Me that where I am you also may be. You know the way that leads where I go." "Lord," said Thomas, "we do not know where You are going. How can we know the way?" Jesus told him: "I am the Way, and the Truth, and the Life; no one comes to the Father but through Me.

c. A reading from the Gospel of John (John 16: 20-22, 28)

"Amen, amen, I say to you, you will weep and mourn, while the world rejoices; you will grieve, but your grief will become joy. When a woman is in labor, she is in anguish because her hour has arrived; but when she has given birth to a child, she no longer remembers the pain because of her joy that a child has been born into the world. So you also are now in anguish. But I will see you again and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy away from you. I came from the Father and have come into the world. Now I am leaving the world and going back to the Father".
