Plan to join us Saturday, June 18, following the 4 pm Mass for a time of procession and prayer. Invite others to come with you to enjoy the evening.




Bishop Gregory L. Parkes serves the diocese with joy and even as he has endured much suf-



Family Connection

There is One, all Holy God, wrapped in Divine Love and



expressed in a Trinity fully One – the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

The mystery of God's self-giving life reflects the truth of sacred scripture manifested as a Self-Offering, giving life to all reality. Think of the last time you witnessed an act of selfless love in your family. Parents and caregivers of all kinds are called upon to act selflessly every day. Family life calls us to share selfless love with one another.

God is the model for us of selfless love. There was no need for God to create our planet or the creatures that inhabit it; it was an act of selfless love. There was also no need for God to send his only Son to save us. That too was an act of selfless love.

As we draw closer to God and the mystery of the Trinity, we learn about God's love. God has lavished us with love in the persons of the Son and the Spirit, who in turn nurture in us the desire to do the same. When we open ourselves to be filled with an awareness of the divine life within us, we participate in the endless spiral of love that leads to eternal life. Whenever we share selfless love in the family, we are sharing in the life of the Trinity.

Jesus we believe Jesus was at the Father's side through all of creation. We see Jesus telling his disciples that the Spirit will guide them after he has returned to the Father. In this short passage all three persons are mentioned and all are clearly equal.

St Paul to the Romans speaks of the Trinity to tell us that through Christ we draw close to the Father with the perseverance and hope given us by the Spirit. The Father wants us to be with him and his Son has shown us the way while the Spirit fortifies us for the journey. All that remains is for us to accept that guidance and follow the path marked out by Christ.

Trinity Family Connection

Invite the All Holy Trinity to pray the rosary with you and all creation. Open yourself to the mystery that enfolds you and all life. Find a guiet place outside or sit near a window. Contemplate the amazing Divine Gift that is before you. Admire it. Reverence it. Become one with it. Ask for the guidance of Brother St. Francis as you pray: "You, Holy Father, are King of heaven and earth. You are three in one, God above all gods. You are good, all good, and supreme good, Lord God, living and true. You are love. You are beauty. You are gentleness. You are joy. You are hope and happiness."

Admire the wonder and majesty of God in all that is around you. Ask for wisdom and understanding. Begin each decade with the Our Father and conclude with the Glory Be. **Decade one**: Contemplate God the Father. As you pray each bead with a Hail Mary, get lost in the grandeur of all that you see. Imagine the thousands and thousands of years of history that is before you. Envision a time when nothing existed. What is nothing? Lift your eyes, heart, and soul to the power and magnificence of the universe, its expanse and its endlessness. You are one with it all. God's creative power.


Decade two: Contemplate God the Son. Behold the squirrels, birds, and critters all conducting life's business. They have heartbeats just like yours. Praying each bead, become one with the incarnate divine life that flows through you and flows with the smallest of creatures. It is holy innocence and blessed life. Tenderness. Compassion, Mercy. Reverence. All want to be held, have a home, and be loved. God in all things. Emmanuel.

Decade three: Contemplate God the Holy Spirit. The changing of times and seasons happens often without notice. It is all within God's care and guided. We all belong. Behold the living, dying, and rising to new life. You are one with all time from beginning into eternity.

Decade Four: Contemplate God as One.

Decade Five: Contemplate God as three. All different while remaining one. The divine dance is being danced before you. Rest in what you see. Become what you see. We are all connected: God of the Holy Trinity, creation, our brothers and sisters, the animals, and the plants.

Up to the Job

Have you ever had a job for which you didn't feel qualified? I think we all have. A lot of us parents often feel in awe of the magnitude of that role and lose sleep worrying that we made the wrong decision in one situ-

ation or a bad call in another. Some of us feel intimidated by what our communities need from us, on the parish level or in our personal relationships. Or maybe we are simply dreading a task that seems too big, too overwhelming that necessary basement cleanout, or the weekly organization of family schedules.

When we don't feel qualified, we don't want to do the work. We get stuck in our own fear. That's the birthplace of procrastination, self-doubt and bitterness. When we look inward at our own abilities, we can only see all the traits that aren't there. The intelligence, the dexterity, the ambition — whatever it is we lack, we get stuck on it.

I've got good news and bad news. I'll start with the bad news: none of us are qualified for the call of discipleship. We simply aren't. We don't have the love or grace or strength to get the job done.

Now I'll give you the good news: God knows this, and He doesn't care. Stewardship does not insist that we possess every good quality — no, as a way of life, stewardship recognizes that we lack so many qualities. But it shows us where to find the love and grace and strength we need. Stewardship does not demand that we know every answer; it merely reminds us who to ask when we don't. — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS ©LPi



Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us.

Jesus, who is one with the Father (John 10, 30), invites his disciples to live in close communion with him, to model their lives on him and on his teaching. He reveals himself as "meek and humble of heart" (Mt 11, 29). Devotion to the



Sacred Heart of Jesus forms the prophetic and evangelic gaze of all Christians on him who was pierced. The gaze of all Christians on the side of Christ, transfixed by a lance, and from which flowed blood and water (John 19, 34), symbols of the "wondrous sacrament of the Church" (St. Augustine).


The Gospel of St. John recounts the showing of the Lord's hands

and his side to the disciples (John 20,20), and of his invitation to Thomas to put his hand into his side. This event has also had a notable influence on the origin and development of the Church's devotion to the Sacred Heart.

Christ is the paschal Lamb, victorious and slain (Apoc 5,6). With much reflection the Fathers unveiled their doctrinal richness. They invited the faithful to penetrate the mysteries of Christ by contemplating the wound opened in his side.

Augustine writes: "Access is possible: Christ is the door. It was opened for you when his side was opened by the lance.

Remember what flowed out from his side: thus, choose where you want to enter Christ. From the side of Christ as he hung dying upon the Cross there flowed out blood and water, when it was pierced by a lance. Your purification is in that water, your redemption is in that blood." Excerpted from the *Directory on* Popular Piety and the Liturgy
