

This week our parish extends a warm welcome to Reverend Father John Thomas Lane, S.S.S., Provincial Superior of the United States Province of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament under the patronage of Saint

Ann. Father Lane was elected to this position of leadership during an August meeting of the priests and brothers. Some lay associates from Texas, Florida, and the Cleveland area joined them to celebrate the charism of their founder, St. Peter Julian Eymard. Pope St. John Paul II honored him with the title, "eminent apostle of the Eucharist."

Father Lane SSS, pastor of St. Paschal Baylon Parish, accepted the appointment to the office of provincial superior. His new duties will allow him to continue as pastor while leading the religious Congregation in the U.S. Before returning to Cleveland, Father Lane ministered in Albuquerque, New Mexico, Houston Texas and Salt Lake City, Utah. He earned a graduate degree in liturgy from the University of Notre Dame. Father Lane has been active in liturgical circles and conventions throughout the country presenting many workshops on liturgy.

Others elected to leadership positions were Father William Fickel SSS, former pastor of St. Paschal who serves as pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Holi-

day, Florida. Father John Kamas SSS, from New York City who serves as the pastor of St. Jean Baptiste Church in Manhattan, and Father Thomas Smithson, a native of Albuquerque, servers as the pastor of Corpus Christ Parish in Houston, Texas.

Often called Father JT as his father is also John Thomas Lane. He will have a full schedule of meetings with the parish staff, finance council and stewardship council. He will also take time meeting with Bishop Parkes and the pastoral staff of the diocese. He gives priority to the sacred liturgy and looks forward to the times of worship with parishioners. Father JT also will meet with area Associate members of the Aggregation of the Blessed Sacrament and those in the neighboring diocese of Orlando.

# **Gospel Reflection**

I recently decided to learn to cook. As I sit at the feet of various YouTube cooking masters, I notice how much of cooking is adding ingredients that don't provide any more nourishment, like herbs and other seasonings. But man! They make all the difference because they make the meal delightful to eat and share.

Jesus calls his disciples "salt of the world." No one eats just salt. So, Christians are not meant to replace or do away with the world. They are meant to be agents of preservation and glorification. Notice how often these days the Church seeks to preserve what is threatened: the goodness of marital and family love, the desires of young people for greatness, the value of honest work, healthy economics, and altruistic political engagement, the dignity of the poor and vulnerable. Over and over, we say to a world who wants to throw things out, "It's worth saving! We'll preserve it! We'll show you it's wonderful." If we can't engage the world like that, Jesus says we are the ones who get thrown out, because salt alone is worthless.

Jesus only asks us to do for others what he does for us. He is the "salt" of everything in our lives. Is there something in your life starting to rot a bit? Something tasting bland and boring? Let Jesus salt it and see if you like it better.

Rev. Elixavier "Xavy" Castro Chaplain of Tampa Catholic High School, "I've been involved with the Good Samaritan Project since I was a seminarian. I've been invited to help at GSP when I was at my pastoral parish at Our Lady of the Rosary. That pastoral year we had a summer assignment to help out at GSP. Ever since, I went back as a priest, I also would come and visit here. What I greatly appreciate about GSP in general is that it's not just about getting service hours. It's about encountering Christ in each other. But here [GSP] it has been a more concentrated aspect of building up those relationships because we're with each other 24-hours a day for the next five days and you just get so many opportunities and you get to know them much better. They get to share about not just the experiences of the retreat, but they point out something maybe in their own life that they realize they need healing or that the graces that have been there or just to share funny stories and build up those relationships."
