Building Our Legacy: 2025-2028

In the last several years, while maintaining ongoing ministries, St. Elizabeth celebrated its centennial anniversary, completed an in-depth visioning process, conducted a facility needs assessment, navigated a global pandemic and conducted a major capital campaign. Because of your generous and faith-filled commitment, the parish can:

Worship and celebrate in a renovated church with a new confessional, remodeled sacristies, a new elevator and exterior ramps

Educate and mold students in a new early childhood center

Gather and build community in a new narthex and a renovated Seton Hall

Provide housing for our dedicated priests

St. Elizabeth now aims to strengthen our faith, build our community, serve our neighbors and educate our youth with a new phase of campus renovations, including: building the St. Elizabeth Gathering Center, installing a multipurpose field and grotto, adding parking by tearing down the former convent and outdated parish ministry center, and retiring the debt associated with the ECC and rectory.

St. Elizabeth Gathering Center & Chapel

On many days and evenings, our current facilities cannot accommodate all our ministry activities and meetings. Even more concerning, the current building being used as the parish ministry

center is outdated, structurally compromised and inefficient. We gather for daily Mass in our sanctuary which is wonderful for weekend services but oversized on weekdays.

A new Chapel will provide an intimate space for daily Masses, prayer experiences for school classes, small memorial services and daily prayer. It will also reduce operating costs and improve energy efficiency by eliminating the need to use our large sanctuary for small services. Parishioners of St. Elizabeth will converse, deepen fellowship, learn, share a meal, or bereave a loved one in the new Social Room, which will accommodate up to 60 people. For informal gatherings, an adjacent and inviting community patio and fire pit will welcome guests.

The scouts will have a room and access to separate outdoor space for meetings and ceremonies. The uniform exchange and the food pantry will operate effectively from the Gathering Center. The Center will provide meeting rooms of different sizes, enabling ministries and programs to work productively and comfortably. School and parish organizations will have space for storage, and parish staff will have comfortable work spaces to efficiently fulfill their roles.







Financial figures are approximate and based on current estimates from our architects and the Building Committee.

Multi-Purpose Field & Grotto

To better utilize its campus, St. Elizabeth will update the current garden into a multi-purpose field on the Northeast corner of the campus. Children might use the field for sporting events or informal games. The parish could host activities and functions on the space.

The grotto honoring the Blessed Virgin Mary will be relocated to the South side of the field.

Demolition, Site Preparation & Parking

When parishioners come to St. Elizabeth for Mass and other community events, they sometimes are left without available parking. To welcome everyone safely and conveniently, the parish will tear down the vacant convent and outdated parish ministry center and replace them with approximately 70 additional parking spaces.

Retiring Debt Associated with the ECC & Rectory

To establish the Early Childhood Center, St. Elizabeth lost its rectory. In 2023, the parish took out a loan to acquire and renovate a house adjacent to our campus to serve as a new rectory. In addition, St. Elizabeth needed to borrow a limited amount of funds to complete the construction of the ECC. To strengthen our financial health and eliminate loan payments so funds can be directed to valuable ministries, St. Elizabeth plans to retire this debt.



We have been going to St. Elizabeth for 46 years and raised our family here. Now, our three grandchildren are here enjoying the same great educational and spiritual experiences our children experienced. We want to make sure that we keep this community here for years to come as the best place to raise your kids in Kansas City.

When should I make my pledge, and when does the campaign end?

May 3-4 is Commitment Weekend.

However, you are welcome to make a pledge at any time. You can fill out a pledge sheet and mail it to the parish office or place it in the weekly offertory. You can also fill out an online pledge form on the "Capital Campaign" page of the St. Elizabeth website. The capital campaign giving period runs May 2025 through April 2028.

How often do I pay on my pledge? How do I submit my pledge payments?

How much you give and when you give is up to you. Many contributors pay a portion of their capital pledge each week or month. Some pay on an annual basis. Others make a one-time contribution. You can select a payment schedule that works for you. You can submit pledge payments using automatic bank withdrawal or a credit/debit card, offering assets, or submitting a check to the parish (monthly envelopes will be available for your convenience).

How is a capital pledge different than our annual stewardship pledge?

Our parish is sustained by annual stewardship gifts. Annual stewardship gifts pay for our on-going expenses. Our capital campaign gifts will be devoted entirely to the Gathering Center and Chapel, multi-purpose field and grotto, parking and parish debt. If you can only make one type of gift, the parish requests you offer an annual stewardship gift.



Opportunities for Giving

Up-front Contributions

For those who are able, please consider making up-front payments or accelerated payments on your pledge to the *Building Our Legacy* capital campaign. These payments would enable St. Elizabeth to begin construction sooner.

Gifts of Income

Most parishioners will support our campaign by budgeting a portion of their monthly or yearly income.

Gifts of Assets

Donating assets — appreciated stock, bonds, or property — may help you avoid paying capital gains and get a tax deduction. If you are interested in more information about this, contact Frank Medina at (816) 523-2405 x3147 or fmedina@stekc.org.

Charitable IRA Distribution

If you are 70-1/2 years old or older, you can donate up to \$108,000 from your IRA directly to St. Elizabeth. It will not count as taxable income, but it can satisfy your required minimum distribution. If you are interested in making a gift in this way, you will need to consult your IRA administrator, tax and/or financial advisor.
