

Blessed Are Our Hassles

s much as we all might like a hasslefree life, for the person of faith the Beatitudes are markers of when God slips into our consciousness. They are life's doorways to a deepening sense of God-with-us.

"Blessed are the poor in spirit" is not about material poverty, though it may include such times. To be poor in spirit is to be dependent upon God because we have run out of our own self-sufficiencies. There is nowhere else to go.

"Blessed are they who mourn" is about times when we grieve the loss of someone or something we love deeply. Who or what will now sustain us?

"Blessed are the meek" is about giving up the need to have our own way all the time. It recognizes that sometimes God's way is breaking into what we prefer.

"Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness," that is, for a relationship with God. It is ultimately a hunger for harmony.

"Blessed are the merciful" is about being forgiving and about those who live out the corporal works of mercy—feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, and the rest. In them we find the presence of God.

"Blessed are the clean of heart" is when we come to realize we cannot have it all. Then there is only one who will satisfy our longing.

"Blessed are the peacemakers" are those who not only love peace but work for peace, for God is peace.

"Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness." They live for an ultimate good greater than their own.

Mass Intentions for the Week



If you request a Mass Intention for a day that Father Nicodemus is not celebrating Mass.

Please rest assure Father is celebrating a personal Mass with your intention.

REQUIREMENTS:

Baptisms: The parents of the child to be baptized must submit a copy of the baby's birth certificate. Parents and godparents need to attend the parish baptismal class. Classes are given on the second Saturday of the month from 10:00 a.m. until noon. Parents and Godparents must make an appointment to speak with Father prior to setting baptism date. Please call the office to sign up for the next scheduled class. All requirements for the Diocese of Tucson and Saint Rose of Lima will be given to the parents at this time. Baptisms are performed the first and third Saturdays at 10:00 a.m. Our office staff is limited, therefore, sponsors and godparents proof of sacraments, documents must be submitted at least one month before the baptism.

Quinceañera: The candidate and parents must contact the office at least one (1) year or more before the date requested. Quinceañera's are not performed during Holy Days. Requirements: Must have Baptism, First Holy Communion and be coming to confession, active within the parish, participate in Conformation/Youth Group, Weekend Mass attendance. Candidate and parents will have 6 meetings with Father Nicodemus. Candidate will know how to pray the Rosary, and will read and be able to recite all the books of the bible. Candidate will need to have proof they carried out twenty (20) hours of four (4) different community services. For a quinceañera it will be \$400.00, which includes a non-refundable deposit of \$100.00 to hold the date. The remining \$300.00 balance must be received in the office one week before the ceremony.

Weddings: The couple must contact office at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. An appointment will be made for the couple. At that time it will be determined if the date desired is available, and all requirements for the Diocese of Tucson and Saint Rose of Lima will be given to the couple. For a wedding it will be \$300.00, which includes a non-refundable deposit of \$100.00 to hold the date. The remining \$200.00 balance must be received in the office one week before the ceremony.

<u>Funeral Arrangements:</u> St. Rose and Our Lady have always asked for a donation to the Parish for its service. We also help those who can not afford funeral arrangements. We work with both mortuaries in town to make these arrangement 's as easy as possible. The Priest may wave the donation if the family is in need. Donation to the Priest and Parish is \$300.00.

<u>Use of the Hall:</u> Rental for the hall is \$50.00 along with a \$50.00 refundable deposit. Deposit will be refunded as long as the kitchen is cleaned, trash is thrown, all tables and chairs wiped off, floors cleared of large debris and bathrooms tidied.

How to be Happy

Here are some ideas on how to live the beatitudes:

- 1. Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. If you share your nice things and don't let your stuff be the most important thing in your life then you will be happy.
- 2. Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted. If you are sad now, remember that in Heaven there will be no more suffering
- 3. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land. Don't be selfish or pushy about things. God will make sure you get everything you need!
- 4. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied. If you try to do what is right then God will make the right things happen.
- 5. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. If you forgive other people when they hurt you, then God will forgive you when you are sorry for your sins against Him.
- 6. Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God. If God is the center of your life, then your heart is pure and ready to see Him in Heaven when you die.
- 7. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. God loves peace, and loves it when we try to avoid getting into fights.
- 8. Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. If you suffer for the truth, God will give you a joyful reward!

<u>All Mass Intentions must be requested at least two weeks in advance, so they can be published in the</u> <u>weekly bulletin and be announced during Mass.</u> Please Note St. Rose of Lima will not accept any Mass Intentions on Good Friday.



St Rose of Lima Religious Education

Students cannot miss over 6 classes (including the classes they miss if they register late), and they must meet the

requirements on the purple agreement sheet. Children new to the parish will have the expectations explained to their parents.

Be sure to say prayers nightly, so your child learns to talk to God in formal and informal prayer. Practice the prayers for confession so children know them by heart.

Sacrament of Penance (confession) requirements:

- ⇒ Student must be Baptized & turn in copy of certificate.
- ⇒ Know the Sign of the Cross, Our Father, Glory Be, Hail Mary, Act of Contrition, Format for Confession, Ten Commandments, and Seven Sacraments.
- \Rightarrow Attend Religious Education classes with fewer than 6 absences.
- ⇒ Attend Mass weekly and turn in signed bulletins with students full name and grade. (Bulletins must be signed by Father)

Sacrament of Holy Eucharist (Communion) requirements:

- * Student must be Baptized & turn in copy of certificate.
- * Student must have made their first confession (Penance)
- Student must have attended at least one year of RE/religious education classes prior to this year
- * Know the Sign of the Cross, Our Father, Glory Be, Hail Mary, Act of Contrition, Format for Confession, Ten Commandments, Seven Sacraments, and know how to receive Communion.
- Attend Mass weekly and turn in signed bulletins with students full name and grade. (Bulletins must be signed by Father)

If the child's name and grade are not on the bulletin they turn in, there is no way to give them credit. I have 27 bulletins without a child's name! Please do not put 2 children's names on the same

bulletin unless you absolutely have to because its harder to sort.

Dates to Remember

Jan. 14, 21 and 28: 3 required Sacrament makeup classes from 10AM to 12 noon have already taken place. If your child missed one class, I have scheduled a 4th class to allow them to have a third session and still be able to learn what they need to, to receive a sacrament. They can also come to say prayers they did not know well, complete a test, etc. These classes are for children off schedule in 3rd -8th grade wishing to make their first confession in Penance and/or first communion in Holy Eucharist. You were sent a letter with a copy of the test(s), the requirements, and Format for confession to seriously study. These classes are a crash course on the 2 sacraments, so we need all the help you can give to prepare your child for one or both. Arrive on time. Come to St Mark's room with your child to sign in, then you can leave till you pick them up at 12 noon or stay to listen and help. Be sure to study the tests with them, and teach them all the prayers, 10 Commandments and 7 sacraments for the tests on Jan 28.

February 7: RE Committee Meeting 5 PM in St. Matthew's room. Teachers and aides should all come to plan Parent Sessions and Lenten activities.


February 6-9: Test 3 given in classes 2nd -8th

February 8 and 9: Attend one of the two Penance Parent Sessions from 6-8:30 PM in the church. All parents of children preparing to make their Penance (confession) are required to attend one of the two sessions. Please be on time.

February 15 and 16: Attend one of the two Communion Parent Sessions from 6-8:00 PM in the church. All parents of children preparing to make their first Holy Eucharist (Communion) are required to attend one of the two sessions. Please be on time.





Dear Padre,

At Mass, why does the priest put a part of the consecrated host into the chalice?

The celebration of the Eucharist was known as "the breaking of the bread" in the Acts of the Apostles (2:42). "The gesture of breaking bread done by Christ at the Last Supper, which in apostolic times gave the entire Eucharistic Action its name, signifies that the many faithful are made one body (1 Corinthians 10:17) by receiving Communion from the one Bread of Life, which is Christ..." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 83). At Mass, bread is broken and wine is poured for Communion, just as the Body of Christ was broken and the Blood of Christ was poured out on the cross. In this fraction rite, we recognize Christ in "the breaking of the bread," as did his disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 23:30-31).



After the fraction of the bread, the priest places a small piece of it into the chalice "to signify the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation, namely, of the Body of Jesus Christ, living and glorious" (GIRM 83). This rite is called the commingling.

While the Agnus Dei ("Lamb of God") accompanies the fraction of the bread, the priest quietly recites a prayer of preparation for Communion "so that he may fruitfully receive the Body and Blood of Christ. The faithful do the same, praying silently" (GIRM 84).
