



NATIONAL Eucharistic Congress

At the National Eucharistic Congress, the Church will draw into a deeper intimacy with our Eucharistic Lord, allowing our eyes to be opened and our hearts to be set on fire with His love.

The whole Congress will be an experience of prayer: a liturgical act offering the Catholic Church—those in attendance in Indianapolis as well as across the country—to the Father, through the Son, and in the Holy Spirit. This reconsecration will result in a massive outpouring of grace and renewed missionary sending as participants are moved to share the Eucharistic love of the Lord “for the life of the world” (John 6:51).

Day 1: Wednesday, July 17

- **10 AM – 4 PM:** Arrivals and check-in on site
- Dinner break
- **5:45 PM:** Eucharistic Procession into Lucas Oil Stadium to kickoff evening activities
- **7:30 PM:** General Session 1—*From the Four Corners*
 - Our opening session is a powerful family reunion as we welcome Catholics from all over the country and all different backgrounds united in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic faith in worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

Day 2: Thursday, July 18

- **8:30 AM:** Catechetical sessions and daily Mass
- Lunch break
- **2:00 PM:** Breakout sessions and festival programming in the afternoon

- **6:30 PM:** General Session 2—*The Greatest Love Story*
 - We will remind ourselves of the saving Gospel message and have an opportunity to respond to Jesus' invitation to believe in him and become a disciple who is nourished and sustained by the Eucharist.

 - During this impactful session, we will ask the Lord for physical healing, the healing of psychological wounds, and the forgiveness of our sins—both individually and as a Body of Christ.

 - Through Scriptural formation, the communion of the Body of Christ, reception of Sacramental Grace, and fervent prayer, we will be prepared and empowered to be Eucharistic missionaries.

 - This last day will commission us to go out into the world as missionary disciples to share the love of Christ in the Eucharist in our homes, schools, workplaces, parishes, and communities.

Track Options:

Encounter

These sessions are for anyone who desires a deeper renewal of their faith and a richer understanding of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, and who is wondering what the next step in their faith journey will be after the National Eucharistic Congress.

Eucharistic Missionary

These smaller, more intimate sessions are for anyone who wants practical tools to become a “Eucharistic Missionary,” evangelizing their community and taking on a deeper role in spreading the Gospel to those around them.

Ministry

These sessions are for any person who serves in a parish, diocesan, or other ministry role, whether you are paid, volunteer, part-time, or full-time. If you are a ministry leader and would like to connect with others who share your challenges and mission, then this is a fantastic way for you to participate at the Congress.

Youth

These sessions are for teenagers aged 14 to 18, including those who are entering high school in the fall or recently graduated the previous spring. Teenagers must register with an adult, a family, or a youth group.

Family

This experience is intentionally designed for parents or caregivers and children to attend together, with activities, talks, and prayers that will speak to every family member. Families with children aged 13 and younger will find these sessions to be particularly impactful. Older children are welcome either to attend with their family or to join a group and attend the Youth sessions during the day.
