2024 Annual Diocesan Appeal: *Sharing His Love with Others*

This year's theme for the Annual Diocesan Appeal (ADA) is "Sharing His Love with Others." This theme is a great reminder of what the Lord calls us to do. We are blessed at St. Gabriel to be able to do so much outreach within and outside of our community. In the first quarter of this year through your generosity the parish has done the "Warmth Drive" for Catholic Charities and about to embark with Rise Against Hunger and the "Cases of Hope" drive for Mercy Mall. The beauty of it is that everyone, irrespective of age or income is getting involved and sharing Christ's love.

Your continued generosity to the ADA and your support to the parish, together with your steadfast faith are manifestations of your total dedication and commitment to support God's work. The Lord continues to bless and replenish our heart giving and sharing one hundred-fold, sixty-fold, and thirty-fold any time we promote His Works of Mercy - Feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, clothing the naked, sheltering the homeless, visiting the sick and imprisoned, etc. (Matthew 25: 35-40)

It is with this in mind that we hope each of you will prayerfully consider supporting the 2024 ADA. Your support of the Appeal provides for twenty-two distinct ministries of our Diocese such as food and shelter for families, support for young men as they study to become our future priests, faith formation for youth and young adults, and so much more.

Because of the Appeal St. Gabriel received a \$2,500 Migrant Ministry grant in 2023 and a \$2,500 Fuel and Hunger grant in 2024. Good Samaritan has also benefited tremendously from the Home Mission grant in 2016, \$10,000 and in 2021, \$4,000. It is worth mentioning the Appeal supports our retired priests. Three few familiar faces helping us whenever we are in need are Monsignor Shreve, Monsignor Miller, and Father Bob. As you can see the Appeal is making a positive impact within and outside of our parish.

Let us not forget that the parish will receive 20% back of what we raise up to our goal amount and then 50% of every dollar raised after we reach our goal. The money we receive helps keep the parish vibrant and able to offer many different programs. To date, our rebate from the 2023 Appeal is \$18,114 with one more quarterly check to be received.

Recently, many of you received a letter from Bishop Knestout asking for your support of the 2024 Appeal. We hope you will prayerfully consider this request. For those who did not receive the mailing, we will conduct our "In-Pew Process" at all Masses during the weekends of February 17/18 and 24/25. St. Gabriel's goal is \$42,180 and Good Samaritan \$2,910.

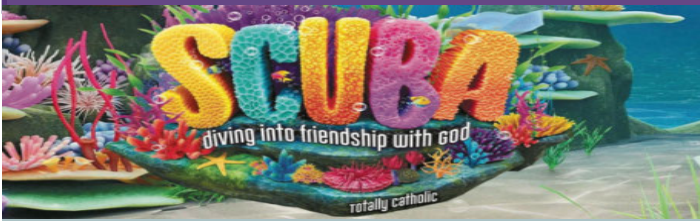

Pro-Life Essay Contest

The St. Gabriel Knights of Columbus Council 13170 is sponsoring a **Pro-Life essay contest** for High School age students in Virginia featuring a first prize award of \$250. Second and third prizes will be granted in the amounts of \$100 and \$50 respectively.

The subject of the essay will be to explain why the writer came to be Pro-Life. The subject is inclusive of all aspects of the sanctity of life from the pre-born stage through the natural end of life.

Essays must be a minimum of 250 words and a maximum of 600 words. All content must be the original work of the contestant, and must be submitted in typewritten hard copy format. Electronic submissions will not be accepted. The essay submission must contain contact information sufficient to allow for the notification of winners, specifically, postal address, telephone number and email address.

Entries must be submitted between Feb. 1 and Apr. 30. To be considered, an entry must be postmarked by the US Postal Service no later than Apr. 30. Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I am the Lord your God ... You shall not have other gods beside me.
—Ex 20:2-3

One of the greatest golfers of all time — if not the greatest — was Jack Nicklaus. Which is why it is baffling that at the beginning of each season he would return to his childhood coach and re-learn how to grip the golf club. It's like Shakespeare re-learning the alphabet and grammar. Why would he do that? Because Jack knew that the fundamentals are always relevant. Perfecting and obsessing over his grip allowed him to do everything else in the game well. In sports and life, the best ones love the basics.

Similarly, as we begin Lent, we re-learn the spiritual basics in the Ten Commandments. Consider the first, to **"have no other gods besides me."** This is our "grip." Is our connection to God one of absolute fidelity and exclusive worship? Am I willing to let go of my precious idols, the things I cling to instead of God? Once we say "yes" to this fundamental question of our spiritual "grip," then we are ready to properly engage with everything else in life. Watch how beautifully the game of life unfolds in the next nine commandments (numbered in parentheses): how we speak to God and others (2 and 8), how we organize our week (3), how we relate to our family (4) and the wider community (5 and 7), how we live our sexuality (6), and how we order all the other desires of the human heart (9 and 10). But don't rush to these later Commandments too soon! Everything in life is built on the first Commandment. The more we focus on worshipping God alone, the better we navigate the complexity of life with panache, effectiveness, and love.

Lenten challenge: This week, identify what you can do to better worship God alone. If you're not sure, scan the last nine commandments to identify what you are most likely to worship instead of God. Power, pleasure, control of your time, possessions, family, health, reputation, money? Commit to concrete action to help you let go of this "idol" to better hold on to God alone in faithful worship. Remember: the best love the basics.
