## Capital Campaign – Growing and Building Together

In the fall of 2024, our parish began a capital campaign for the new formation/administration building. The project is projected to cost \$4.5 million dollars. We were blessed to receive \$3,022,575 in pledges. Our blessings continue because you are honoring your pledges. Currently we have received \$1,312,158 or 43/4% of the amount pledged.

**First Reconciliation**

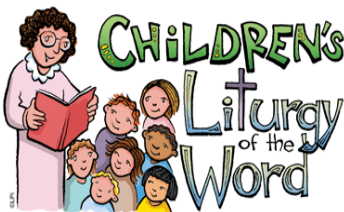
- Has your child been baptized and reached the age of reason: 7 years old?
- Does your child know the difference between right and wrong?
- Can your child distinguish between mistakes or accidents and deliberate wrongdoing?
- Does your child express sorrow for wrongdoing?
- Does your child forgive others?
- Does your child pray at home and at Mass?
- Does the family attend Mass regularly?
- Does your child relate to Jesus as one who forgives?
- Are you committed to the sacramental preparation process and having your child attend every preparation session and a parent attend every ROCK session?

**First Communion**

- Has your child been baptized and reached the age of reason: 7 years old?
- Has your child received First Reconciliation, or will he/she be enrolled in preparation class for Reconciliation?
- Is your child interested in receiving Holy Communion?
- Does your child pray at home?
- Does your child regularly attend and participate in the Sunday Mass?
- Does your child relate to Jesus as one who loves and cares for them?
- Does your child understand that they are to care for others?
- Does your child have a sense of belonging to the Catholic community?
- Are you committed to the sacramental preparation process and having your child attend each preparation session?

## Mary is Mother of the Church

We Catholics understand the Blessed Virgin Mary to be the Mother of the Church, that is, of all who believe in Christ. Mary was united with Christ as mother to son, and in the same way, she is united to the Church because we are all in Christ.

We believe she lives now in glory raised up by God who first chose her and revealed to her the divine plan for salvation. We give her the title, "Queen of Heaven," because we believe so fervently that she shares in her son's resurrection. We give this name: Mary's Assumption.

## The Virgin Mary is Our Mother, Too!

The Blessed Mother is a unique member of the Church because of her role in the divine plan of salvation. It is fitting and right, therefore, for us to give her reverence and for us to copy her faith, her obedience, her burning charity. The Virgin Mary shares in the divine light which guides us in our spiritual journey. We give her reverence and honor her and, in doing so, we give her the name of advocate, helper, benefactress and mediatrix.

Because of her important role the Church honors Mary with devotion. All devotion to the Blessed Mother honors Christ, and leads to Christ. Indeed, in the words of Mary's great song, the Magnificat, recorded in Luke, chapter 1, verse 48, "From this day all generations will call me blessed!"

Mary uttered these words not to bring praise to herself but to express the tremendous blessing it was for her to have been chosen for this mission.

In looking to the Blessed Mother we in the Church hope to see ourselves. We hear her words, we recall her great trust, her journey of faith and her unity with Christ now in heaven.
