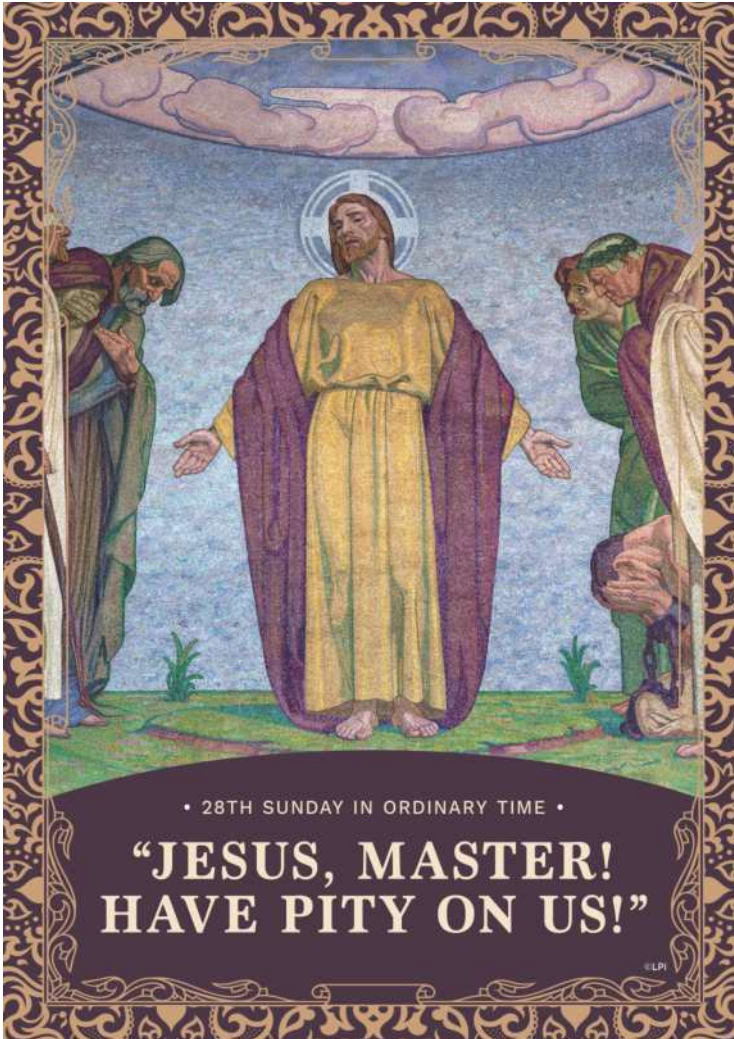

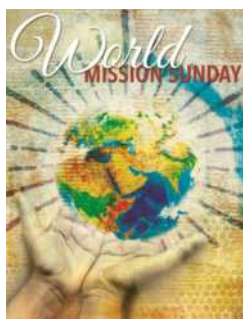

World Mission Sunday - October 19

What is this year's theme?

"Missionaries of Hope Among all Peoples". It reminds individual Christians and the entire Church, the community of the baptized, of our fundamental vocation to be, in the footsteps of Christ, messengers and builders of hope. We trust that it will be for everyone a time of grace with the

faithful God who has given us new birth in the risen Christ "to a living hope."

This is why World Mission Sunday makes a difference.

Celebrated every year on the second-to-last Sunday of October, World Mission Sunday is the day when Catholics around the world unite to support the missionary work of the Church. Established by Pope Pius XI in 1926, it remains the only annual global collection that directly supports the 1,124 mission territories where the Church is young, struggling, or persecuted. On this day, every parish, in every diocese, in every country, joins in prayer and giving to ensure that missionaries can continue their vital work—building churches, forming priests, supporting catechists, and serving communities in need.

How to Give.

Voter Registration and Voting

As Virginia voters, this fall we will elect our next Governor, Lieutenant Governor & Attorney General. We will also decide who will occupy all 100 Virginia House of Delegates seats. Election Day is November 4 and early voting began on September 19.



As the Catechism reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate, each according to his position and role, in promoting the common good...As far as possible, citizens should take an active part in public life" (nos. 1913-1915).

To be eligible to Register to Vote in VA a person must:

1. Be a resident of Virginia.
2. Be a U.S. citizen.
3. Be 18 years old.
4. Not be registered & plan to vote in another state.
5. Not currently declared mentally incompetent by a court of law.
6. If convicted of a felony, your right to vote must have been restored.

Persons eligible to register can obtain a registration application either on-line, <https://vote.elections.virginia.gov/Registration/DmvLookup> or go to your local voter registration office. These would be the easiest and fastest ways to register.

You must be registered 11 days prior to the election to be able to vote.
