Couples need to contact the pastor before scheduling a wedding at the parish. The presider will coordinate all preparation needed. It is recommended couples schedule this at least one year in advance to give adequate time to prepare.

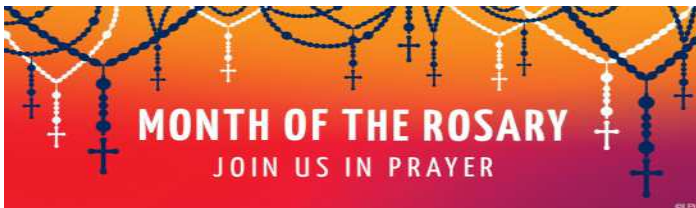
PARISH VISION STATEMENT

Please remain aware of your surroundings while entering and leaving the church. If you notice anything unusual (like a car parked for long periods of time in the extremities of the lot), please stay in your vehicle or in the church, and call the Chesterfield County Non-Emergency line: 804-748-1251. Thank you for doing your part to keep our parish safe.

PLEASE NOTE:

For parishioners who are hospitalized, in a rehabilitation or care center: During the admissions process be sure to provide your religion and parish. This will enable you to receive communion from ministers if they come to that particular facility. Only you or a family member can contact the parish to inform of the hospitalization. Health care facilities do not automatically contact your parish unless instructed to do so by you or your family. Friends cannot speak on your behalf.

If you are home to recuperate or become homebound, only you or a family member can reach out to the parish office and request to be added to the prayer list or have communion brought to your home.

The budget is divided evenly over the 12 month fiscal period. Please bear in mind that all donations do not come weekly or monthly. The parish receives quarterly, semi-annual, and annual donations.

For more than 35 years, CCHASM has provided families across Chesterfield, Colonial Heights, Dinwiddie, Hopewell, Petersburg and Prince George with the ingredients for a meaningful Thanksgiving.

With Rising costs and food insecurity affecting thousands, our Thanksgiving Program ensures that no one in our community is forgotten during the holiday. Each family receives a full nonperishable Thanksgiving meal bag to support a celebration at home.

Each meal is identical therefore please only purchase items and, in the size, listed below:

- 1 - 40 oz. can of yams or sweet potatoes
- 1 - 13 oz. box of mashed potatoes
- 1 - 14 oz. can of cranberry sauce
- 2 - 15 oz. cans of corn
- 2 - 15 Oz. Cans of green vegetables
- 2 - boxes of Stove Top Stuffing (no bags)
- 2 - cans or packages of gravy (no glass jars)
- 1 - box of hot chocolate
- 1 - box of tea bags
- 1 - box or bag of cookies

Please:

- Check all items for expiration dates. We cannot give out expired food.
- All items must be in their original saleable packages, no pre-opened items, no bulk items.
- Please place all items in double paper bags with handles or canvas grocery bags.

Bring your items with you to Mass either the weekend of November 8/9 or 15/16. You can always drop your items off at the office during normal business hours.

Each meal also comes with a \$20 Food Lion gift card to put toward a Thanksgiving meal. You can make a monetary donation toward purchasing gift cards using the QR code. Click on "one-time donation," and scroll down the fund list to select CCHASM Thanksgiving. You may also donate by check; please make it payable to St. Gabriel Catholic Church and write "Thanksgiving Meal" on the memo line. You can mail checks in, or drop off in the church office or the mail slot at the Welcome Table. Thanks!

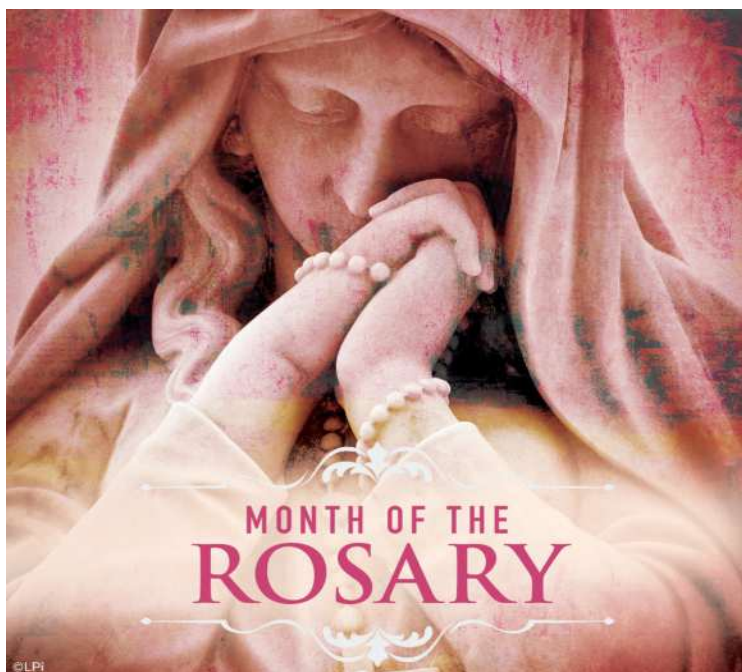

Question: What is the history of the rosary? Where did this prayer come from?

Answer: Although a longstanding tradition attributed the rosary to Saint Dominic and the Dominican Order, the practice of using beads to count prayers predates the Dominicans by a few hundred years. In fact, it seems that what we now think of as the rosary (which means “garland of roses”) was first developed by illiterate peasants and religious brothers and sisters as a way of offering 150 “Our Fathers” to replace the praying of the 150 psalms in the Divine Office.

The practice of reciting 150 Hail Marys (which was later subdivided into 15 decades of 10 Hail Marys) arose during the late Middle Ages. Devotion to the rosary began to flourish in the nineteenth century, especially as new devotions to Mary began to spread throughout Europe and the New World. An annual liturgical celebration of Our Lady of the Rosary was introduced into the Church calendar in 1573 and it has been observed on the date of October 7 since 1913.

In the apostolic letter On the Most Holy Rosary, Pope Saint John Paul II not only added five new mysteries to the traditional fifteen, but he also reminded Catholics that the rosary is, at its core, an opportunity to go deeper into the life of Jesus: “The rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer ... It has all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety, of which it can be said to be a compendium. It is an echo of Mary’s prayer, her perennial Magnificat ... With the rosary, the Christian people sit at the school of Mary and are led to contemplate the beauty of the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love” (no. 1).

Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week

The Pharisee took such pride in his good deeds that he forgot to ask God for forgiveness; the tax collector acknowledged his many sins, and went home justified. Remember that we are saved not by our own merit, but by the mercy of God.
