Fiscal year end – 2022/23 Report

We are very thankful for the love and support we receive at St. Gabriel. Fiscal year 2022/23 saw the close to our 25th anniversary celebrations. Bishop Knestout celebrated our anniversary Mass in October which ended our silver jubilee year.

We realize that many are struggling with increased costs across the board but we are blessed that you still find it in your hearts to make your donation to St. Gabriel. It is through your offertory donations that our parish can survive and grow.

Offertory was down by 5% from the prior year. To ensure we kept to our budget we froze the three open staff positions. As of now, no programs have been affected but we cannot guarantee that as we move forward.

Our safety is a priority to us and during the year we were able to:

- Install a new automatic door lock system on the church doors. Remotely, the church can be locked, and the doors are monitored.
- Install three more light poles to increase the lighting in the parking lot directly across from the front doors, near the wooded area.

Both projects were funded through the money we received from the diocesan Living Our Mission campaign.

As the phone system was obsolete and failing and sporadically losing or dropping calls, the phones were replaced with a new “cloud” based system.

During the spring clean-up the walking path in the prayer garden was widened and renovated. It enabled people to use it during Lent to walk the Stations of the Cross.

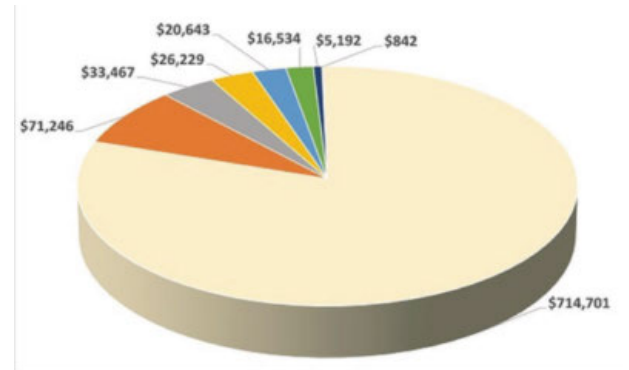
- The parish showed its *Love in Action* over the fiscal year through our social justice ministries.
- We were able to bring back Richmond Friends of the Homeless Bagged Lunches which was suspended during the pandemic.
- Richmond Friends of the Homeless hot lunches are once again being cooked in the kitchen on the 4th Thursday of the month and then brought into Richmond to be served.
- The parish had an overwhelming response to the Angel Tree program at Christmas. By using a QR code and online giving access, everyone was able to participate no matter the amount of the donation. The parish raised \$20,050.
- During Lent the parish hosted a Rise Against Hunger event which made 10,000 rice and soy meals.

None of this could have been done alone...it takes all of us to keep Christ's church alive and vibrant. We kindly ask you to continue to support the church and all our ministries with your time, talent, and treasure. We continue to pray for God to bless you and your families.

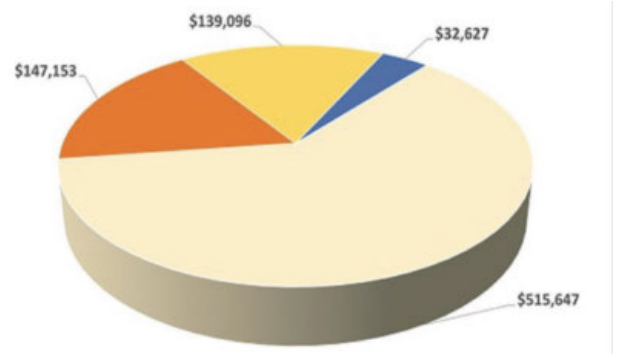

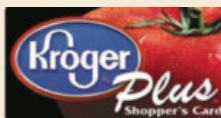

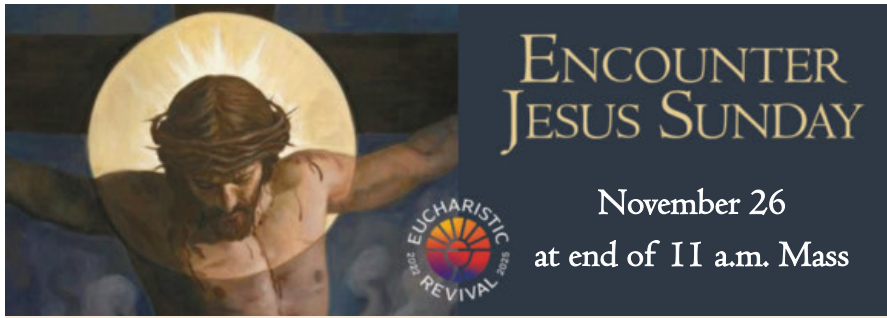

- Registration enables our pastor, staff, and community to get to know you better, to welcome and minister to you. This is especially important during a time of crisis so that the pastoral staff can attend to your spiritual needs and the needs of your family.
- For the parish to record sacraments, as required by church law, and faith formation for your household, you need to be registered.
- Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Providing your contact information is important so that parishes provide you with timely updates via email, direct mail, phone, etc. Also, in supporting your parish, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will also receive a year-end statement of your donations for income tax purposes. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address or phone number.
- Registered active members are eligible for sponsor/ godparent validation.
- Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.



Are your Young Adult Children still listed under your parish registration? Have your children moved out of the house and are now on their own? Even if they are members under your household, it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass, **and to register as a member independent of their parents.** Encourage them to register through the website or the QR code above.
