




LIVE THE LITURGY



Covid-19 Vaccine Quick Info

Many people have lingering questions about the Covid-19 Vaccines. Three vaccines are currently approved for use in the US: Pfizer/Biontech, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson. Here is a quick summary and my recommendations.

Facts:

- Coronavirus vaccine research and development started over 10 years ago and use techniques used for over 30 years
- These vaccines can not cause CoVid
- Still at risk to contract CoVid especially within first 3 weeks of receiving first vaccination
- 2 doses of Pfizer/Biontech or Moderna prevents about 95 out of 100 CoVid cases but also means about 5 out of 100 people will still get CoVid (known as vaccine failures) so you should still use common sense and protect yourself especially in large crowds and while indoors. Adults over age 65 should exercise extra caution, as our immune systems don't work as well when we age.
- 1 dose of J&J prevents about 66 out of 100 CoVid cases but also means about 34 out of 100 people will still get Covid after receiving J&J one shot and done vaccine. As above advised to take reasonable precautions.

Bottom Line:

- All three vaccines are Safe and Effective and have each been used in millions of diverse patients ages 12 and over (Pfizer/Biontech while Moderna ages 18 and over)
- The 1 shot and done J&J vaccine starts working within a few days, but is probably best for men 18 and up & women 50 and over as it's associated with rare complication of blood clots in younger women.
- All are effective at reducing risk of serious or deadly infections

My opinion:

I currently recommend Pfizer/Biontech or Moderna vaccines as the current studies show they also work against newer CoVid variants. J&J was released more recently and simply has not been studied with the CoVid variants.
