Dear Parishioners and Friends...

Three years ago, Cardinal Blase Cupich appointed me to serve as your Pastor at Immaculate Conception Parish. While this appointment brought a lot of joy and excitement into my life, I also felt fear and hesitation initially, as I questioned whether I was truly prepared for the mission that had been entrusted to me - namely, to shepherd a large parish community equipped with an equally large school. Fortunately, all those worries disappeared upon my arrival at IC. I was deeply moved by the way our parish family warmly welcomed me and helped me to feel at ease in my new surroundings. Within a few weeks of my stay at our parish, I truly felt at home. Thank you for graciously embracing me as one of your own.



The last three years of my life as your Pastor have been a great blessing to me. With your assistance and guidance, I feel that I have matured as a priest, having grown wiser and more deeply grounded in pastoral life during my time at IC. Throughout our ongoing journey of parish renewal, your love and generosity has served as a source of inspiration for me, allowing me to dream big as I envisioned the future of Immaculate Conception Parish. Thank you for accompanying me on this journey and for supporting my vision of transitioning our parish from maintenance to mission. Although our time together has been relatively short (and there is still much work to be done), I am humbled and grateful that we have accomplished so much together— from clarifying our mission as a parish (to *love God, serve others and make disciples*) and developing our long-term pastoral plan, to completing extensive (and long deferred) maintenance projects to help fortify and beautify our Church building (including the recent installation of our new carpeting and the planned installation of our new Sound and Video System later this year.) I pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to guide and inspire our parish in my absence, as my friend and Associate, Fr. Matthew, capably assumes leadership of IC going forward, continuing the work we began together of leading our parish family closer to Christ.

I am incredibly grateful to Fr. Matt, Deacon Rick, Deacon Ron and Deacon Mike for their support and guidance on my priestly journey. I am truly grateful to our dedicated Parish Staff, our School Faculty and Staff, my Core Leadership Team, our Pastoral and Finance Councils, our parish and school organization leaders and volunteers, and all of you for the support and love you have kindly offered me over these past three years. I am grateful to God for providing me with the opportunity to work with each one of you, as you have all made your mark on me by helping me to become a better person and a more faithful disciple of Christ. Thank you for your friendship and thank you for your continued commitment to our parish and school. I will always hold the memories of your goodness and generosity in my heart.

As our parish continues our gradual reopening process this summer and Fr. Matt transitions into his new role as your Pastor, I will continue to keep you all in my prayers, and I ask for your prayers in return as I prepare myself to begin my new assignment as Administrative Secretary to the Cardinal on July 1st. Although my time as your Pastor has come to an end, I am happy to say that our journey together has not, as I will continue my ministry at IC (in a limited role) by serving our community as our Weekend Assistant (a role previously held by Fr. Peter Snieg), assisting Fr. Matt with our Sunday Masses as needed (and as my schedule permits.) Given the current circumstances that prevent us from gathering together as a parish family for a formal farewell celebration (as well as our prolonged separation from one another over these past few months), I am grateful to still be able to continue my relationship with our IC community going forward in the months to come.






Live the Liturgy – Inspiration for the Week

"Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" What do you understand these words to mean? Many see these words as an indication of what may come in eternal life. In actuality, they have more to do with our lives here and now. We are called to die to ourselves and offer our lives as gifts given generously to others. It is not about us. We are asked to serve God and not continue in our service of sin. Life is about learning to do what we really do not want to do because it brings us deeper into the mystery of God, ourselves, and others. Learning how to accept and live with the "small deaths" and sacrifices we encounter teaches us how to live with and approach our final death. We can do so with a heart that has been touched by and is open to mercy or one that is self-focused and closed.




