

Father Leslie Hoppe, OFM on "Jesus in Jerusalem"

This illustrated lecture will trace the final days of Jesus' life and ministry, which were spent in Jerusalem. It will highlight what we know from history, archaeology, the gospels. We will also look at the evidence of Christian pilgrimage to the Holy Places and the state of the Jerusalem church today. Father Hoppe is a Carroll Stuhmueller Distinguished Professor of Old Testament Studies and teaches for the Catholic Theological Union.


