Did you know Fr. Matt's presence at St. Luke the Evangelist can be traced to a vacation he took twenty-five years ago?

Fr. Matt discovered Palm Harbor, Florida in 1993 while on vacation with relatives who were visiting family members in the area. He enjoyed the visit and the locale so much that he returned regularly over the course of the next eighteen years. Naturally, when it came time to retire, Florida was his top pick as a place to live, with St. Luke the Evangelist Church, being his first choice for a parish.

During his vacation stays, Fr. Matt particularly enjoys celebrating Mass with the children of the parish, visiting St. Luke's Early Childhood Center and Guardian Angels Grade School. He says Mass once a month at St. Peter the Apostle in Trinity, Florida, visits area nursing homes, is Chaplain for the Knights of Columbus at St. Luke the Evangelist and travels to Holiday, Florida to serve as Spiritual Director of the Lay Carmelites (of which he is a member) at St. Vincent De Paul.
