Being here and witnessing the way each teacher has set up their room is the first thing that I noticed. The focus on each classroom was to provide art work and items that represent the time period the grade will be studying throughout the academic year. Beautiful artwork and artifacts fill the classrooms. There is a sense of order and organization in each room. Rooms have a common color palette and items that are not used all the time are out of sight. What is in sight when you enter the classrooms is Jesus. You know you are walking into a Catholic school classroom. Virtues are displayed and the different habits you learn from the virtues are listed. Our scholars will know that habits are important and creating good habits is something that will remain with them for life. Prayer areas are a huge focus in each classroom. The rooms are inviting, but not over stimulating. There is a sense of calmness in each room, but each room has its own flair. Our teachers created these wonderful, beautiful learning spaces while taking physical distancing into consideration. What amazing educators we have working with our youth at SCBA.

Today is our first Friday with our Friday Folders! The scholar who you identified as the scholar who will be bringing the Friday folder home, will have the folder today. Please sign and return to school on Tuesday, September 8, 2020.



In your scholar's family folder, you will find a Daily Family health Check card. We are asking families to check your scholar each morning before you leave the house.
