## Applicant Eligibility Requirements

- Graduating high school senior in the Class of 2018 with a minimum 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Applicants must include an official high school transcript that includes your first semester senior-year grades and your cumulative grade point average
- Applicant must be an active, registered member of St. John the Baptist Catholic Parish in Newburgh as determined by the Parish office.
- Confirmed Catholic and in good standing.

- If more space is needed, please attach a separate sheet of paper with the necessary information, clearly indicating in which application section it belongs.
- All applications must include the following:
  - Official high school transcript
  - Essay
