

## **SERVICE HOURS**

On the night before Jesus died, He washed the feet of His disciples as an example of how we are to serve others. In Confirmation, we receive the invitation to be servants like Jesus. As Confirmed Catholics and adult Christians, we accept that invitation and recognize that we are called to be Christ to one another.

In working on service projects, we experience the rewards of helping others and learn that as Christians, we support and serve one another every day. It is hoped that you may find great reward in your service hours, and from that at least one type of service that you enjoy and wish to continue as a Confirmed member of the parish, your family, and Christian community. Service to one another becomes a lifelong commitment.

To give you the opportunity to experience following Jesus' example, we ask you to do twenty-four (24) hours of service work for others. You should complete a minimum of eight (8) hours in each of three areas of service: Parish Community, Greater Community, and Family. You should not expect payment for any of your service projects. Please have the enclosed form filled out by the person(s) for whom you have served. If you forget to do this, your parent can fill the paper out and sign it.
