FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends In Christ,

Below you will find a summary of the Liturgical Survey that I conducted for our parish. I realize the survey was taken a while back, but we have already made an effort to address some of the issues raised by survey participants. I'm so grateful to everyone who participated in this survey. Please note that some of the language in this summary may sound "harsh" or "strong". However, the language used in the summary is used to convey, sometimes verbatim, what was captured in the survey in order to give you an accurate picture of the data collected, as I did ask everyone to be forthcoming with their thoughts. May God continue to bless our parish and all who enter our doors! St. John the Baptist, Pray for Us!



Relevant Data to the Recent Liturgical Changes

Of the three topics discussed in the survey, there was a clear order in regard to overall satisfaction. Far and away, people were most satisfied with the celebration of the liturgy. Nearly 60% of all surveys either highlighted the celebration as something they were happy with or not in need of any notable improvements. Indeed, the most common feedback received in terms of what is being done well in the liturgy involved the reverence of the celebration of the liturgy (72 surveys) and the quality of homilies (59 surveys). By comparison, the percentage of overall satisfaction dropped notably for the questions concerning the physical church building, which had a satisfaction rate of 27%, and especially those concerning sacred music, which had a satisfaction rate of 16%.

While the suggestions about the physical church were fairly consistent in addressing quality of life issues such as poor lighting (38 surveys), issues with the sound system (32), or a dislike for the carpet (27 surveys), the critiques and suggestions concerning sacred music were much more varied. Many asked for more contemporary music and less traditional hymns while a similar number asked for the exact opposite. A notable number mentioned a desire to encourage the congregation to sing as well as a desire to use easier or more well-known hymns. This desire for an expanded hymn list was one of the most commonly reoccurring responses (32 surveys). Other issues with the sacred music highlighted that the choir could use some improvement and was largely comprised of older and higher voices. Such concerns extended to the cantors as well, highlighting how several of their voices had faded over time and could be a bit shrill, especially since there are few cantors with voices on the lower end of the register. Overall, there was a general attitude that, while it had many merits, the music program needed a refresh overall, especially if more of the congregation is to begin singing.

All of the criticisms or suggestions that appeared time and time again dealt with topics explicitly mentioned on the survey with one exception. Although not mentioned on the survey, an immense number of responses mentioned a desire to encourage or work to bring more young people into St. John the Baptist (32 surveys). Many echoed their fears that the church was occupied almost solely by the older generations (indeed, 67% of responses came from those over the age of 60). Similarly, many echoed a desire to see young people participating more in the liturgy. However, the suggestions about how to bring young people in varied greatly. Some suggested more contemporary music and less older hymns, while others argued for the opposite. Many even suggested some sort of family Mass or children's choir.

While the suggestions concerning how to reach the youth varied greatly, the response from the younger demographics themselves were far more uniform. Among the various age ranges surveyed, those under 40 were much more likely to report an overall dissatisfaction with the parish's sacred music. Indeed, less than 5% reported being satisfied with it compared to the 16% satisfaction rate among all responses. Nearly half of the younger respondents expressed a desire for less of the contemporary music while a similar number asked for more traditional, reverent, and well-known hymns and Mass parts. Conversely, they were more likely to report an overall satisfaction with the celebration of the liturgy, with nearly 80% complimenting it or offering little feedback. The most common positive feedback from respondents under the age of 40 was an appreciation for the reverence when celebrating the liturgy, which showed up in over half of their responses. In terms of the building itself, the younger demographic was less likely to have major complaints than other age ranges, but there was a substantial amount from this group that expressed a love for the design of the chapel and/or a dislike of the carpeted sanctuary in the church.

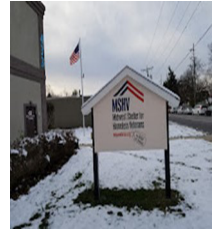

SVdP Parishioner Report (Fiscal Year October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023)

St. John the Baptist members of the Society of St. Vincent DePaul and the families in need in our community wish to thank those who have generously donated to our organization. During the past year, we have been able to help 87 families with \$55,371 in housing assistance, utility bills, and emergency funds. Our food pantry program has distributed more than 759 bags of food for 205 requests. Our annual Thanksgiving and Christmas gift card collection has replaced the food basket donations. \$7,125 in gift cards were donated by parishioners and distributed last Thanksgiving to 73 families. \$13,610 in gift cards for 73 families and children were donated and distributed last Christmas.

Donate Tax Free From Your IRA

Did you know you can give from your IRA to St. John the Baptist without having to pay income taxes on the money? This is called an IRA charitable rollover or qualified charitable distribution (QCD). Beginning in 2023, when you turn 73, you can use your gift to satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution (RMD). (In 2019, the trigger was set at the age of 72). Gifts of any value of \$100,000 or less are eligible for this benefit and you can feel good knowing that you are making a difference in your parish. Contact your retirement provider to get started.
