

SACRIFICIAL GIVING

Offertory collections for the parish were \$15,623 for the weekend of October 23, 2022. For the current fiscal year, collections were \$336,830 or about \$32,000 below our expected cost of operations. We know the economy has been a difficult one for all this year, as we too have felt the impact of significant cost increases during the year. Your continued support, sacrifice and prayers are truly appreciated.

Priests are essential to our Catholic faith, as only these holy men can transform bread and wine into the life-giving Body and Blood of Christ. Although the number of priests has been on the decline for decades, the Diocese of Joliet has been blessed with an abundance of vocations to the priesthood.

Currently, our diocese has 23 men in seminary formation, which costs \$50,000 a year per seminarian. To ensure we are always able to support our seminarians both prayerfully and financially, the Diocese of Joliet has launched the I Will Give You Shepherds campaign.

At Masses next weekend, our parish will take up a second collection for this campaign. Gifts will be invested in an endowment designated specifically for seminarian education, and your support directly impacts our own Deacon Alex and Seminarian Sam.


Thank you to all who came out to witness for life at Waterleaf, across
