

Third Sunday of Lent, March 12, 2023

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends in Christ,

So far this Lenten Season, we have talked about praying, fasting, almsgiving and reconciliation. This week I would like to spend a little time talking about the Stations of the Cross.

The Stations of the Cross depict the Passion of Christ, a series of fourteen events that begin with Christ being condemned by Pontius Pilate, and ending with our Lord's death and entombment. While we can pray and meditate over the Stations of the Cross at any time, there is a stronger focus during the Lenten season during which we ultimately celebrate Christ's Rising from the dead to save our souls and allow us to be Led to Heaven.

There is no one way to pray the Stations. While there are individual prayers that exist for this purpose, you can use your own prayers, or simply meditate and try to take in what it must have been like for our Lord at that time. Some people even find that a specific Station has more meaning for them.





Particularly during Lent, I find that going through the Stations can be a very powerful experience. I encourage you to go through the Stations of the Cross during the Lenten season, including Friday evenings at 7pm where we have set aside a weekly time for group participation in our beautiful chapel.

I also find myself once again being very proud of our SJB grade students during this Lenten season. They pray regularly, including weekly Mass, have received Ashes, have taken part in reconciliation, and yes, they too attend the Stations of the Cross weekly!

In the spirit of Lent, and recognizing the trials and tribulations our Lord went through for us, I thought it might be appropriate to make the Stations available at a glance. So, for quick reference, here they are:

Jesus is Condemned to Death Jesus Carries His Cross

- 3. Iesus Falls the First Time
- 4. Jesus Meets His Mother, Mary
- 5. Simon of Cyrene Helps Jesus Carry His Cross
- 6. Veronica Wipes Jesus' Face

- 9. Jesus Falls for the Third Time
- 10. Jesus is Stripped of His Garments
- 11. Jesus is Nailed to the Cross
- 12. Jesus Dies on the Cross
- 13. Jesus is Taken Down from the Cross
- 14. Jesus is Placed in the Sepulchre
