FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends In Christ,

I received some positive feedback about my two prong approach to last week's bulletin article – part liturgical and part non-liturgical. So, I'm going to use the same approach this week. This week's Gospel is a bit of a classic. It contains scripture that is pretty widely known, it involves Jesus and a miracle, and it results in a still often used cliché.

Not that long after his miracle of feeding 5,000 people, Jesus was again with His disciples. He sent them back to their boat to head to sea – the Sea of Galilee, and went to a mountain to be alone to pray. Night fell, and stiff winds and waves made navigating the boat difficult. The disciples paddled the boat through most of the night against stiff winds and stormy waves. And, while they are distressed from being in the boat with bad weather, they suddenly see Jesus before them. He was walking towards them on the water. As you might imagine, there was some concern as to how this was possible, or that maybe he was even a ghost.

Jesus spoke though, and told them not to be afraid. By one account, Peter asked “..if it is you Lord, ask me to come upon the water.” To which Jesus responded “Come.” Peter left the boat and headed toward Jesus, but with the turbulent wind and water he began to panic. He started to sink and cried out “Lord, save me.” Jesus reached His hand out and took hold of him saying, “O you of little faith, why did you doubt?”

There are a number of lessons we can learn from this week's Words, but one of them is clearly about faith. Peter at first looks like he should be commended for his belief, but then he starts to have doubt. This can happen in life. Sometimes I think it's easier to have faith than at other times. I think for some of us, understandably, when we have distress or panic in our lives, it's sometimes difficult to have strong faith when things aren't going well for us. Try to remember, that's exactly when we need to lean on our faith, and ask God to pull us back into the safety of the boat. Just some food for thought.

And speaking of food, for today's second segment, I thought I would do a fun article and share one of my favorite summer recipes – smoked ribs.

I love smoking meats!! Some very generous souls purchased me a smoker this past Christmas and it's so much fun. Some of my recipes are original, some are shared and some are from Google. I enjoy this recipe and hope you do as well:

- Season the ribs with a lot of dry rub the night before.
- Cook them slow and low. 225F on the smoker.
- At 2 hours mop them with a mixture of apple cider vinegar, bbq sauce, and dry rub.
- At 3 hours pull them off and place them in foil. Wrap them tight with butter, brown sugar and bbq sauce.
- 4 or more hours more on the smoker still at 225F
- Bring them in and let sit for 15-20min.
- Open up the foil and enjoy ribs right off the bone!



This is also a recipe for the spiritual life. Slow and low. Do little things for God over time, and our soul gets to Heaven.

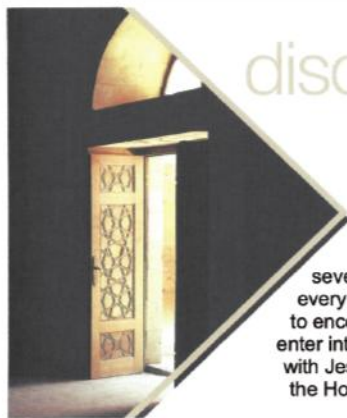


Make-A-Will Sunday

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The Illinois tax credit scholarship program has proven to be a beacon of hope and a guiding force toward a better life for thousands of Illinois students and their families. However, that light may be snuffed out unless the Illinois General Assembly acts to continue the law that provides for this program. Therefore, we are writing to ask you to contact your Illinois state representative and state senator to express your desire to retain the tax credit scholarship program.

Since its inception six years ago, the tax credit scholarship program has generated overwhelmingly positive results. Nearly 40,000 scholarships have been awarded to students attending private schools in the state. These scholarships are funded through contributions from donors who receive a 75% tax credit for their donation on their Illinois state income tax. All of the scholarships are need-based. Without this program, Illinois families may be unable to send their loved ones to the school of their choice. Demand for scholarships is high - for every scholarship granted, three students were turned down due to lack of funds.

Allowing the tax credit scholarship program to sunset would not only be a life altering disservice to the families it is designed to help, but would also create long-term consequences by weakening the state's educational choices and placing additional roadblocks in front of thousands of Illinois students on the path to a brighter future.

Please contact your state representative and state senator to let them know you support extending the tax credit scholarship program in Illinois law. We also encourage you to urge your fellow parishioners to do so also. Our collective voice is needed. The Diocese of Joliet and St. John the Baptist Catholic School has partnered with Empower Illinois to offer eligible families a chance to receive a tax credit scholarship towards their tuition through the Illinois Invest in Kids Program. Empower Illinois is proud to help hard-working, passionate, and loving parents give their children the education that is right for them.

The Illinois Invest in Kids Program has already been a tremendous benefit to St. John the Baptist students. During the 2022-23 school year, 54 of our students were granted full or partial scholarships totaling \$300,000. Forty-five scholarships have been awarded for the coming school year and 25 eligible students remain on a wait list pending additional funding.

We're working diligently to increase donations to the program to provide additional tuition assistance to more families in order to receive a St. John's education.
