

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends In Christ,

Happy November! This is my favorite time of year! The air is nice and crisp and you need a hoodie or a jacket most days, the leaves are beautiful colors, and Advent is coming, my favorite season of the church year!

With the upcoming celebration of Advent, we change gears in the Catholic Church in a few weeks, just as the outside world changes around us. In fact, we begin a new Church year, and begin the liturgical calendar all over again as we prepare for our Lord's Nativity at Christmas.

At the local level, in the past several weeks, we've experienced a number of changes at St. John's. We've seen our grade school grow to over 210 children, we've seen our RE program take off strong with approximately 200 children, for what we hope to be another successful year, we've seen our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program begin for our littlest parishioners and local children, we've started our Adoremus Children's Choir, and we've raised over \$130,000 towards a new air conditioning unit for the Church, just to name a few of the highlights!

We have plenty of other good things in the works too. For example, a more robust altar serving program that Mr. Mike Berger and I are working on, some great events for the Eucharistic Revival that the Eucharistic Revival committee and I are organizing, some adult formation opportunities Ms. Sarah Reznicek and I are working on for all our parishioners, including some targeted initiatives for our RE and grade school families, just to name some of those highlights too. More on those in the future as they become a reality!

I realize that with all these good things, there have had to be some changes in the ways things always were done at St. John's, and some things are now different. We've introduced a number of new staff positions at the parish level, as well as in this Year of the Eucharist we've elevated the celebration of the Mass and made some musical changes with the Sacred Liturgy, which is the most important prayer we have as a Catholic Church and needs to be treated with the utmost respect, reverence and honor, for it is where Heaven and Earth come together and we receive the Eucharist, the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ!

Change is hard for everyone, and these changes are a consequence of moving forward in our parish mission, "Leading Souls to Heaven". I realize that I "shook the snow globe" so to say at St. John's with some of these changes. In the personal feedback I've received, I have had a majority welcome the changes I have made and support me in them, and I've also had some vocalize their preference to keep things the way they always were, which I can respect due to the fact I stated above, change is hard.

Through prayer and discernment, consultation with brother priests much wiser than me, feedback from parishioners, and trying to implement the Bishop's vision of Catechize, Evangelize, and Putting Faith into action, I as your pastor have made the decisions I've made for St. John's in order that our souls may make it to Heaven! I truly have felt the Holy Spirit put these changes I've made on my heart as the path we are meant to take as a community, and I as your shepherd desire to lead you on this path.

Once again, I humbly recognize change is hard, but I would be failing you as a pastor if I didn't lead and make change. Just like water that's constantly moving stays fresh and life giving, and stagnant water becomes unusable, so too with change. We need to constantly be evaluating, changing, improving, and trying to meet our mission as a parish. If we don't, we become stagnant.

Heaven needs to be our number one priority! The Mass and the Eucharist, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation need to be our life blood! We need God more than ever in our world, and St. John's is going to continue to be a place where we can come encounter the Living God and where Heaven and Earth continue to meet.

So, as the "snow globe" settles, I invite you to join this journey with me! We are well on the path together, we aren't turning back, but keeping our eyes fixed on the Mission, "Leading Souls to Heaven"!

Please be assured of my prayers for each of you, and please pray for me.

Donate Tax Free From Your IRA

Did you know you can give from your IRA to St. John the Baptist without having to pay income taxes on the money? This is called an IRA charitable rollover or qualified charitable distribution (QCD). Beginning in 2023, when you turn 73, you can use your gift to satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution (RMD). (In 2019, the trigger was set at the age of 72). Gifts of any value of \$100,000 or less are eligible for this benefit and you can feel good knowing that you are making a difference in your parish. Contact your retirement provider to get started.
