

## A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today we're publishing the financial report for our fiscal year that ended June 30, 2023. Your continuing generosity helped us to achieve a modest surplus of \$35,355. The generous heart of this Parish especially supports the formation of our children in our School and Religious Education ministries. School enrollment increased last year, so the additional tuition helped reduce the subsidy to the School from 26% to 14%. This is a huge improvement!



However, we will likely face a big challenge for the 2024-2025 year. As you may be aware, the Invest In Kids program, also known as Empower Illinois, was allowed to expire by the Illinois government. Our Nov. 26 bulletin told how this program provided more than 9,500 scholarships to qualifying low-income families in Illinois this year. In our Parish School 73 students, about one-third of our enrollment, benefit from these scholarships, so losing this program could really hurt us. I will be working with our staff and Finance Council to identify ways to fund our school so students in need can continue to receive our high-quality Catholic education and formation.

You can help. I understand that the current economy is tough on most of us. Please pray about whether you can afford a modest increase in your donation to St. John the Baptist Parish. I hope you see that we are acting responsibly as stewards of our financial resources, with our goal of leading souls to Heaven always in our intentions.

Finally, please accept my personal thanks for all you do to support our Parish! Your prayers, your time and energy, and your donations are what help us to thrive. I am blessed, humbled, and gratified to be your Pastor, be assured that you are always in my prayers.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our diocese will soon take up the national collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious. Your support for this collection December 9/10 provides financial assistance for retirement needs for 297 U.S. religious communities.

Catholic sisters, brothers and religious order priests—collectively known as women and men religious—have selflessly served for decades without significant financial compensation. However, due to escalating health-care costs, numerous U.S. religious communities face a substantial gap between their elderly members' needs and the financial resources available for their care. Many religious orders currently experience insufficient retirement savings.

The 2022 appeal demonstrated Catholics' tremendous generosity by raising \$27.6 million. Diocese of Joliet parishioners contributed \$286,788.25 to the collection.

The senior religious in our diocese never retire from their vows, and they play a crucial role in conveying the faith from one generation to the next. In their younger years, they laid the foundation for Catholic schools, hospitals, and works of mercy. Today, many serve in volunteer ministry as ongoing witnesses to the Gospel. Others are frail and need assistance, yet all remain wholly committed to their vocations by embracing the opportunity to spend more time praying for our Church and world.

Please support the retirement needs of our senior religious. And please join me in praying for God's continued blessing on our nation's elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests.

- Religious communities are financially responsible for the support and care of all members.
- •There are 24,005 religious past age 70 living in the United States. In 2022, the average annual cost for their care was roughly \$55,500 per person; skilled nursing care averaged \$82,700 per person.



#### Donate Tax Free From Your IRA

Did you know you can give from your IRA to St. John the Baptist without having to pay income taxes on the money? This is called an IRA charitable rollover or qualified charitable distribution (QCD), which you can begin to make when you turn 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  years old. And, you can use your gift to satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution (RMD) if you turn 73 in 2023. (In 2019, this trigger was set at the age of 72). Gifts of any value of \$100,000 or less are eligible for this benefit. For married couples, each spouse can donate up to \$100,000. And, you can feel good knowing that you are making a difference in your parish. Contact your retirement provider to get started. ## An Introduction to Catechesis of the Good Shepherd - Part 1

Our new Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program for children 3-6 years old has been underway for just over one month and I wanted to take a moment to share with you a little more about it!

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a hands-on approach for children to come to know and love God. It is rooted in Sacred Scripture and the Liturgy and based on the educational principles of Dr. Maria Montessori, focusing on the child's developmental needs and the unique relationship between God and the child. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd originated in Rome, Italy in 1954 through the work of Sofia Cavalletti, a Catholic laywoman and Hebrew, biblical scholar and Gianna Gobbi, a Montessori educator. Cavalletti wrote of their work and what they observed about the spirituality of children in the book, The Religious Potential of the Child.

Catechesis takes place in the "atrium", a specially prepared environment, a place for prayer, where the child and the adult listen and learn from the one Teacher, Jesus Christ. Every object in the environment of the atrium is a help to knowing God and is intended to be appropriate to the ages and sizes of the children who gather there. For example, all the furniture is child-sized, even the artwork is arranged at a level for the child's viewing. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd sessions are 2 hours which allow time to slow down, listen, pray, work, sing, wonder, ponder, and to just "be" with God.

Our St. John the Baptist atrium is located in the Parish Office Building in High Hall and is specially prepared for children from 3-6 years old. Catechesis takes place on Friday and Saturday mornings. We have 27 children ages 3-6 years participating. The plan is to continue to grow and expand to be able to offer Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for children up through age 12.


