

#### LOOKING BACK AND LOOKING FORWARD

Today's readings look back at both the Crucifixion and the Resurrection, remembering the promise given to David that Jesus would be raised from the dead. The Psalm and First Peter look forward to our lives as we await our resurrection and consider the sacrifice made by Jesus. Luke tells us the story of another experience of the risen Jesus. The disciples unknowingly walk with Jesus and tell him of the Crucifixion and the Resurrection. Jesus himself looks back with them to the promises made to Moses and all the prophets about his death and resurrection. Still they do not know who he is. It is only when he blesses and breaks bread and shares it with them that they realize it is Jesus. Then they race back to Jerusalem to tell the others.

#### SLOW OF HEART

After the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus, two of the disciples hit the road and try to escape all the uncertainty, fear, remorse, and guilt they feel. They feel the same regret that the disciples feel in Acts and First Peter. They meet another man traveling the same road and are astonished when he seems to know nothing about the events that so occupy their thoughts. These events have consumed them, have broken their hearts, have left them downcast and blind to the very person who joins them on their journey. Their companion, Jesus, takes them through their own tradition, through the Old Testament promise that someone just like him would come, be killed, and would rise from the dead. Though they do not recognize him by the words alone, they do not want him to leave. Lucky for them he stays.

#### IN THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

Despite all the hints, the disciples do not recognize Jesus. They remain consumed with their own confusion and fear and they cannot see who is right in front of them. It is only with the blessing, breaking, and sharing of the bread that they suddenly recognize Jesus. No words, however insightful, can penetrate the confusion and fear the disciples feel. Through the simple act of breaking and blessing bread they recognize Jesus. Even as their "hearts were burning," their minds did not know. How often do we not see what is right before us because we

are so consumed with our own worries, regrets, concerns? Like the disciples it takes an action like the breaking of the bread, a reminder of the death of Jesus, his sacrifice, to get us to understand what our hearts already know.

#### LEARNING CONTINUES AT ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST CATHOLIC SCHOOL...AT HOME!

Dear Parishioners of St. John the Baptist Catholic Church,

It is with a grateful heart and with sincere gratitude for you that I offer this letter and update. Thank you for the support you provide to the school, especially your financial support. We are able to continue to offer a quality Catho-

lic education to our children, even during this coronavirus pandemic and the resulting "shelter at home order" because of you.

During this time, our students continue to learn. I am thankful for Father Matt and the entire parish for your support and prayers. Our parents appreciate it as they assist their child/ren during these days of at home and remote learning, communicating with our teachers, and helping to structure and help maintain a structure which is similar to that of a school day while in many cases working from home. Our students also appreciate your support as they work on their studies. It is a blessing to have our teachers who each day are delivering well planned, targeted instruction, with the challenge and the excellence that is the standard of Catholic education. I am able to view the videos, photographs, projects, and examples of what our students are working on each day.



Throughout this time, we have continued to find ways to connect with one another and provide direct instruction through the car-



ing and creative ways of our teachers as shown through a recorded video to teach a lesson, accessing Google classroom or using Seesaw, which are platforms to share lessons, instruction, and student work; and having face to face time with students through video meetings, including one on one, small group, whole class lessons, and office hours to check in and ask questions. Our students are progressing in religion and their academics, as preschool and primary students practice and refine their early literacy and numeracy skills while our intermediate and junior high students are doing novel studies and having discussions, as well as learning new principles and theories in science and reinforcing long division, learning decimals, and algebra in mathematics. Religion is also taught and activities include creating a collaborative Stations of the Cross, practicing prayers and learning about the 7 days of God's magnificent Creation in verse and song, and attending daily Mass through the online parish You Tube Channel and reflecting on the readings. In addition to class work, our specialists continue to provide learning opportunities through varied methods ranging from an art service project called "Operation Smile," to collaborative technology projects, to online quiz games and at home physical education. We continue to unite in faith through our daily prayers each morning and at the end of the day led by teachers, students, Father Matt and Father Tom, and me. We are even finding ways to stay close to one another and celebrate birthdays with cards, video messages, and birthday parades whereby fami-

lies are driving by homes of our birthday honorees.

While we wish that it was different right now, our "new normal" represents an opportunity to stretch and support each other in different ways. I have learned that St. John's is a resilient and caring community that has demonstrated great courage and strength in the face of challenges.

In the meantime, I continue to prepare for the future of our school, which excites me because of the remarkable children, families,

teachers and staff with whom I have the honor and privilege of working with daily. I continue to plan with the staff not only those areas and things that we do well, but also areas in which need strengthening. All of us continue to be hopeful and can't wait to return to school as SJB family to grow in faith, academics, and as individuals.

It is not this health crisis alone that defines this time in history; it also depends on how we choose to respond to it. Investing in this temporary change and disruption to normal day-to-day life is a worthwhile endeavor; we are doing it together. And when we reach the other side, St. John the Baptist Catholic School and parish will emerge as the exceptional place it has always been. Registration continues to be open for the 2020-2021

school year. Come see what Catholic education is all about.



# RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION NEWS



# WHY IS A TAX CREDIT BETTER THAN A DEDUCTION?

A tax credit is always better than a tax deduction because a credit lovers your tax bill directly. A deduction lowers your adjusted gross income on your IRS Form 1040, so the amount you get reduced off your tax bill is directly tied to your tax bracket.

Example: Tax Credit vs. Tax Deduction

For example, if you make a \$1,000 Tax Credit Scholarship donation you receive a \$750 tax credit which lowers your tax owed to Illinois by \$750. Simple as that. If your tax bill was going to be \$3,000, you just reduced it to \$2,250.

However, what would happen if that was a deduction on your IRS Form 1040 and not a tax credit? A \$1,000 deduction, if you are in the 22% tax bracket, will lower your adjusted gross income by \$1,000, thereby lowering your tax bill by about \$220. In this scenario, we also assume that the taxpayer is itemizing their deductions. If the taxpayer takes the standard deduction (\$12,400 if filing single or \$24,800 if married filing jointly), then the \$1,000 donation would not provide any tax benefit.







Evangelium Vitae (The Gospel of Life) written by Pope St.John Paul II 25 years ago on March 25th, reaffirmed the Church's constant teaching on the value of every human life. Below are quotes from that document

#### On Life and the Role of Science

"Respect for life requires that science and technology should always be at the service of man and his integral development. Society as a whole must respect, defend and promote the dignity of every human person, at every moment and in every condition of that person's life." (Evangelium Vitae)

#### The Church and the Defense of Life

"Every individual, precisely by reason of the mystery of the Word of God Who was made flesh (cf. Jn 1:14), is entrusted to the maternal care of the Church. Therefore every threat to human dignity and life must necessarily be felt in the Church's very heart; it cannot but affect her at the core of her faith in the Redemptive Incarnation of the Son of God, and engage her in her mission of proclaiming the Gospel of life in all the world and to every creature (cf. Mk 16:15)." (Evangelium Vitae)

"Not only is the fact of the destruction of so many human lives still to be born or in their final stage extremely grave and disturbing, but no less grave and disturbing is the fact that conscience itself, darkened as it were by such widespread conditioning, is finding it increasingly difficult to distinguish between good and evil in what concerns the basic value of human life." (Evangelium Vitae)

#### SPIRITUAL ADOPTION

Our parish Respect Life Committee invites you to continue the nine month commemoration of the gestation of the Child Jesus in Mary's womb, which began March 25, and to spiritually adopt a baby that is in danger of abortion, if you haven't already done so.
