A letter from our pastor, Father Matt/Una carta de nuestro párroco, Padre Mateo

Dear First Communicants,

Congratulations for receiving Holy Communion this weekend for the very first time! This is a special weekend for you. You received Jesus, who is present in the Eucharist. The night before Jesus died for us, He took bread and said, "This is my body, given up for you," and he

took a chalice filled with wine, saying, "This is the chalice of my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant which will be poured out for you and for many..." You have been told many times how much Jesus loves you. The world saw how much He loves us when He died on the cross and rose from the dead for us. As Jesus began this most loving act, He gave us the Eucharist. His loving gift of Himself echoes and continues through the Church in every Mass. Jesus gives us Himself as our bread; He is our food for the journey to heaven. At every Mass, Jesus strengthens us and calls us together to be united to Him. At the Last Supper, when He instituted the sacraments of the Eucharist and the Priesthood and gave us the commandment to love one another, He prayed that we would be one in Him, the source of life and joy: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower... Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit..." (Jn. 15:1, 4-5a). We need Jesus. He gives us life. Every time we come to Holy Communion, we renew our union with God; we remain in Him, and He in us. Let us stay close to our Lord and give Him thanks for the most holy gift of the Eucharist. May this sacrament give us strength, and may we stay close to Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, joyfully and lovingly receiving Him in Holy Communion this weekend and always.

I also look forward to celebrating the May Crowning with you. May our Blessed Mother, who brought Jesus to us, keep us close to Him. Know of my prayers for all of you, and please continue to pray for me and one another.

Divine Mercy Sunday

Divine Mercy Sunday is today, the Sunday after Easter, April 28th. Today, there will be a service at 3PM in the Chapel.

The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy, is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.

On June 29, 2002, the Apostolic Penitentiary of the Holy See promulgated a decree creating new indulgences that may be gained by the faithful in connection with the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday. This decree grants a plenary indulgence to those who comply with all the conditions established, and a partial indulgence to those who incompletely fulfill the conditions. It is allowed for one to go to Confession up to 20 days, before or after Divine Mercy Sunday and still receive the indulgences.

Relics of St. Pio of Pietrelcina to Visit the Diocese of Joliet, IL

The relics of St. Pio of Pietrelcina, popularly revered as Padre Pio, will be at St. Bernard Catholic Church, 1301 Sterling Ave. at High St., Joliet on Friday May 3, 2019. Veneration of the relics will be from 9:00 AM to 6:30 PM. Mass in Honor of St. Pio will be celebrated at 7:00 PM by The Most Reverend R. Daniel Conlon, Bishop of Joliet.

In the Catholic Church, relics are physical objects associated with a saint or candidate for sainthood - part of the person's body or something that he or she was in contact with. Relics are not worshipped but treated with respect. Touching or praying in the presence of such an object helps the faithful focus on the saint's life and virtues, so that through the saint's prayer or intercession before God the individual will be drawn closer to God. The relics include St. Pio's glove, crusts of his wounds, blood-stained cotton gauze, a lock of his hair; his mantle (cloak); and the saint's handkerchief soaked with his sweat hours before he died.

The Saint Pio Foundation, which is sponsoring the relics tour, will sell books and items related to St. Pio at the Church.

St. Pio was born May 25, 1887, in Pietrelcina, Italy, and baptized Francesco Forgione. He first expressed his desire to become a priest at age 10. In order to pay for the preparatory education, his father, Grazio Forgione, emigrated in 1899 to what is now New Castle, Pennsylvania, where he worked for several years.

The future saint entered the Capuchin order at 15 years old, taking the name Pio. He was ordained a priest in 1910 at age 23.

During his lifetime, Padre Pio was known as someone with miraculous powers of healing and knowledge who bore the stigmata, a term used to describe the wounds an individual receives that correspond to the crucifixion wounds of Jesus. They can appear on the forehead, hands, wrists and feet.

His stigmata emerged during World War I, after Pope Benedict XV asked Christians to pray for an end to the conflict, Padre Pio had a vision in which Christ pierced his side. A few weeks later, on Sept. 20, 1918, Jesus again appeared to him, and he received the full stigmata. It remained with him until his death Sept. 23, 1968.

Pope John Paul II canonized him in 2002.

The Saint Pio Foundation promotes awareness of St. Pio and his mission by working with institutions and individuals to serve "those in need of relief of suffering." Funds raised by the foundation are used to provide grants to American Catholic health care, educational, social, religious and cultural partner organizations.

Spiritual Adoption

Our parish Respect Life Committee invites you to continue the nine month commemoration of the gestation of the Child Jesus in Mary's womb, which began March 25, and to spiritually adopt a baby that is in danger of abortion, if you haven't already done so. Around the 25th of each month a bulletin article will explain the growth of the babies. Choose a name for your baby and pray for thema nd their parents using Archbishop Fulton Sheen's prayer below and pray for them daily. There will be prayer cards on the tables in the narthex of the Church and Chapel and by the baby poster in the Church. Jesus and yoru adopted baby are counting on you. "Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion."

THE SECOND MONTH

Surely by now Mary has told her parents, Joachim and Anne, of her pregnancy. What must they think? How will they tell Mary's betrothed, Joseph the Carpenter? The law would have Mary stoned for adultery. They must trust in God! Today's unwed teenage mother may never know the comfort of loving parents or the warmth of understanding support without the IL Parental Abortion Notification Act. The law may allow her to terminate her infant, without parental guidance or knowledge, before it has begun its journey into life. At two months, the child in the womb has a fully functioning body with fingers, toes, a brain, its tiny heart beating twice as fast as an adult's. His milk-teeth are present at 61/2 weeks. Though only a little over an inch, it is now apparent that the baby is a boy or girl.

Pray for teens in crisis pregnancies, that God will strengthen them to make the right choice. Pray also for the defeat of the repeal of the Illinois' Parental Abortion Notification Act HB2467/SB1594.

St. John the Baptist Parish will conduct its **Baby Bottles for Life** campaign to benefit, support & educate pregnant women facing crisis or



unintended pregnancies. The funds collected through the Bottles for Life campaign support the programs & services of the Waterleaf Women's Center. Waterleaf provides practical help; pregnancy testing, ultrasounds, STD testing and treatment as well as continuing education and support for women in our community who would otherwise be at risk for choosing abortion. Stop by the tables in the narthex after Mass today to sign one of the petition sheets available there. The purpose for these petition sheets is to let our Illinois legislators know there is great opposition to the four dangerous bills (summarized below) introduced in the Illinois House and Senate in February, 2019.

A letter was sent to the Illinois legislators last month from all of our Illinois bishops opposing these bills. There is no restriction on who can sign this petition. Even nonvoters and under-aged individuals can sign. As the petition states, "women, girls, babies, and society deserve better."

HB 2495--SB 1942

If passed, this House and Senate bill would REPEAL the current state ban on partial-birth abortions, define abortion as a fundamental right, remove abortion clinics from regulations for serious medical procedures, and remove the requirement that only doctors can perform abortions.

HB 2467--SB1594


If passed, this House and Senate bill would REPEAL Illinois' Parental Notification of Abortion Act. In 2013, the Illinois Supreme Court issued a unanimous ruling in favor of the current Act which requires a parent or legal guardian be notified when a minor seeks an abortion. It includes a waiver for children who have been physically or sexually abused.

Flyers are available at the tables which give more details on the bills and show our area legislators' names and contact information if you would like to follow up with a call to their offices. If you want to verify your legislator, go to www.ilcatholic.org and under the Action heading, go to "find and contact your legislator," then enter your zip code and if necessary your home address.

After the petition drive, we will make copies of the filled sheets for each legislator and make an appointment at the legislators' local offices and several from our parish will hand deliver the petitions. (The portion on the right side of the petition will be removed before delivering to the legislator. That space is for the parishioner to add an email address if they want to stay updated on abortion legislation affecting our area; this will not be shared with the legislator.)
